1 (e)] (1) The recipient of an Economic Development Student Assistance Grant 2 shall repay the Commission the funds received as set forth in § 18-112 of this title if 3 the recipient does not:

21 aggregate awards under that title exceed the maximum amount permitted under this

22 Act, may continue to hold each of those scholarships or grants so long as the

23 individual continues to meet the eligibility and renewal criteria for each financial

24 assistance program.

25 SECTION 2. <u>3.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 26 effect October July 1, 2002.
