18 Preamble

- 19 WHEREAS, The occurrence of asthma has been increasing in the United States
- 20 and worldwide, and has led to the identification of asthma as a major public health
- 21 problem; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Asthma is a chronic and troubling disease that affects over 10
- 23 million adults and over 5 million children in the United States; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Over 500,000 Maryland citizens have asthma, including 95,000
- 25 adolescents and children; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Nationally, the number of deaths, hospitalizations, and emergency
- 27 room visits due to asthma has been increasing; and

- WHEREAS, In order to help establish the factors underlying the development of
- 2 asthma, and the complications of asthma, it is important to understand its prevalence
- 3 and the circumstances associated with periods of increased symptoms; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Surveillance is a key public health tool in identifying associated or
- 5 causative factors; and
- 6 WHEREAS, A comprehensive, integrated State plan for the prevention and
- 7 control of asthma is central to reducing the impact of asthma on the population; now,
- 8 therefore.
- 9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 10 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 12 SUBTITLE 16. ASTHMA CONTROL PROGRAM.

- 14 IN THIS SUBTITLE, "PROGRAM" MEANS THE ASTHMA CONTROL PROGRAM.

- 16 THERE IS AN ASTHMA CONTROL PROGRAM IN THE DEPARTMENT.
- 17 13-1603.
- 18 (A) THE SECRETARY SHALL APPOINT A DIRECTOR FOR THE PROGRAM.
- 19 (B) THE DIRECTOR MAY ESTABLISH ADVISORY COUNCILS, TASK FORCES,
- 20 COMMITTEES, AND WORK GROUPS TO THE EXTENT NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE
- 21 PROGRAM.
- 22 13-1604.
- 23 (A) THE DIRECTOR SHALL:
- 24 (1) ESTABLISH A STATEWIDE ASTHMA COALITION COMPOSED OF
- 25 INDIVIDUALS AND ORGANIZATIONS WITH AN INTEREST IN ASTHMA;
- 26 (2) DEVELOP AND FINALIZE A COMPREHENSIVE STATEWIDE ASTHMA
- 27 PLAN;
- 28 (3) AFTER FINALIZATION OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE STATEWIDE
- 29 ASTHMA PLAN, IMPLEMENT A STATEWIDE ASTHMA INTERVENTION PROGRAM;
- 30 (4) DEVELOP AND ORGANIZE COLLABORATIVE RELATIONSHIPS WITH
- 31 ASTHMA CONTROL AND STAKEHOLDERS WITHIN OTHER STATE AND LOCAL
- 32 AGENCIES AND IN THE PRIVATE SECTOR;

- 1 (5) DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT AN ASTHMA SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM;
- 2 (6) UPON COMPLETION OF THE ASTHMA SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM IN
- 3 PARAGRAPH (5) OF THIS SUBSECTION, IDENTIFY MECHANISMS FOR THE UTILIZATION
- 4 OF SURVEILLANCE DATA IN IDENTIFYING INTERVENTIONS TO CONTROL ASTHMA;
- 5 (7) IDENTIFY AND PROMOTE EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS FOR
- 6 PROVIDERS, PARENTS, GUARDIANS, CAREGIVERS, AND ASTHMA PATIENTS THAT
- 7 INCLUDE INFORMATION ON IDENTIFYING SYMPTOMS OF ASTHMA AND EFFECTIVE

- 9 (8) IDENTIFY SOURCES OF GRANT FUNDING FOR THE ASTHMA CONTROL
- 10 PROGRAM.
- 11 (B) THE PROGRAM MAY:
- 12 (1) PROVIDE FUNDING FOR LOCAL ASTHMA INTERVENTION
- 13 INITIATIVES; AND
- 14 (2) PROVIDE TRAINING FOR SCHOOL PERSONNEL, OR OTHER
- 15 APPROPRIATE PERSONNEL, ON ASTHMA EDUCATION IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE
- 16 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION AND LOCAL HEALTH DEPARTMENTS.

- 18 (A) THE PROGRAM SHALL BE FUNDED AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.
- 19 (B) THE FUNDING PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET FOR THE PROGRAM IS
- 20 INTENDED TO COMPLEMENT FUNDING RECEIVED:
- 21 (1) BY THE DEPARTMENT FROM THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL
- 22 AND PREVENTION FOR THE PROGRAM FOR ENHANCING THE STATE'S CAPACITY TO
- 23 ADDRESS ASTHMA FROM A PUBLIC HEALTH PERSPECTIVE; AND
- 24 (2) FROM ANY OTHER LAWFUL SOURCE.
- 25 13-1606.
- 26 THE SECRETARY SHALL, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DIRECTOR, ADOPT
- 27 RULES AND REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE PROGRAM.
- 28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Secretary of Health
- 29 and Mental Hygiene shall report to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of
- 30 the State Government Article, to the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental
- 31 Affairs Committee and the House Environmental Matters Committee on or before
- 32 December 1, 2005 and each December 1 thereafter describing the activities of the
- 33 Asthma Control Program created by Section 1 of this Act.
- 34 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 35 October 1, 2002.
