	WHEREAS, The occurrence of asthma has been increasing in the United States and worldwide, and has led to the identification of asthma as a major public health problem; and			

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- WHEREAS, Asthma is a chronic and troubling disease that affects over 10
- 2 million adults and over 5 million children in the United States; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Over 500,000 Maryland citizens have asthma, including 95,000
- 4 adolescents and children; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Nationally, the number of deaths, hospitalizations, and emergency
- 6 room visits due to asthma has been increasing; and
- WHEREAS, In order to help establish the factors underlying the development of
- 8 asthma, and the complications of asthma, it is important to understand its prevalence
- 9 and the circumstances associated with periods of increased symptoms; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Surveillance is a key public health tool in identifying associated or
- 11 causative factors; and
- 12 WHEREAS, A comprehensive, integrated State plan for the prevention and
- 13 control of asthma is central to reducing the impact of asthma on the population; now,
- 14 therefore.
- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- THE SECRETARY SHALL, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DIRECTOR, ADOPT
- 34 RULES AND REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE PROGRAM.

- 1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Secretary of Health
- 2 and Mental Hygiene shall report to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2-1246 of
- 3 the State Government Article, to the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental
- 4 Affairs Committee and, the House Environmental Matters Committee, and the
- 5 <u>Children's Environmental Health and Protection Advisory Council</u> on or before
- 6 December 1, 2005 and each December 1 thereafter describing the activities of the
- 7 Asthma Control Program created by Section 1 of this Act.
- 8 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 9 October 1, 2002.
