## 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Higher Education - Resident Tuition Charges - Immigrant Students

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing certain eligibility criteria for certain individuals who
- 4 are citizens of a country other than the United States to qualify as residents of
- 5 Maryland, under certain circumstances, for purposes of certain tuition charges
- 6 at two-year or four-year public institutions of higher education in the State;
- 7 and generally relating to tuition charges for certain resident noncitizens to
- 8 attend two year or four year public institutions of higher education in the State
- 9 prohibiting the governing body of a community college from denying certain
- individuals eligibility for a certain tuition status under certain circumstances.

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 1 Article - Education

- 3 (A) UNLESS A STUDENT ESTABLISHES RESIDENCY IN MARYLAND AS
- 4 PROVIDED UNDER SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, TUITION TO ATTEND A PUBLIC
- 5 INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS STATE FOR A STUDENT WHO IS A
- 6 CITIZEN OF ANY COUNTRY OTHER THAN THE UNITED STATES IS THE SAME AS THE
- 7 TUITION REQUIRED OF OTHER NONRESIDENT STUDENTS.
- 8 (B) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, AN INDIVIDUAL
- 9 SHALL BE CLASSIFIED AS A MARYLAND RESIDENT UNTIL THE INDIVIDUAL
- 10 ESTABLISHES A RESIDENCE OUTSIDE THIS STATE IF THE INDIVIDUAL:
- 11 (1) GRADUATED FROM A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOL OR
- 12 RECEIVED THE EQUIVALENT OF A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA IN THIS STATE;
- 13 (2) RESIDED IN THIS STATE WITH THE INDIVIDUAL'S PARENTS.
- 14 GUARDIAN, OR CONSERVATOR FOR AT LEAST 3 YEARS PRIOR TO THE DATE THE
- 15 INDIVIDUAL GRADUATED FROM A PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOL OR
- 16 RECEIVED THE EQUIVALENT OF A HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA:
- 17 <del>REGISTERS AS AN ENTERING STUDENT IN A PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF</del>
- 18 HIGHER EDUCATION IN THE STATE NOT EARLIER THAN THE 2003 FALL SEMESTER;
- 19 AND
- 20 (4) PROVIDES TO THE PUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION AN
- 21 AFFIDAVIT STATING THAT THE INDIVIDUAL WILL FILE AN APPLICATION TO BECOME
- 22 A PERMANENT RESIDENT WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE INDIVIDUAL BECOMES
- 23 ELIGIBLE TO DO SO.
- 24 THE GOVERNING BOARD OF A COMMUNITY COLLEGE MAY NOT DENY AN
- 25 INDIVIDUAL ELIGIBILITY FOR RESIDENT TUITION STATUS FOR ATTENDANCE AT THE
- 26 COMMUNITY COLLEGE ON ACCOUNT OF THE INDIVIDUAL'S IMMIGRATION STATUS IF
- 27 THE INDIVIDUAL HAS THE CAPACITY TO ESTABLISH DOMICILE IN MARYLAND.
- 28 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 29 October 1, 2002.
