15 16	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

	(a) Except as otherwise specifically provided in this title, a person who violates any provision of this title is guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, is subject to a fine not exceeding \$500, with costs imposed in the discretion of the court.

- 1 (b) Unless another penalty is specifically provided elsewhere in this title, any 2 person found guilty of a second or subsequent violation of any provision of this title is 3 subject to a fine not exceeding \$1,000, or imprisonment not exceeding one year, or
- 4 both, with costs imposed in the discretion of the court. For the purpose of this
- 5 subsection, a second or subsequent violation is one which has occurred within two
- 6 years of any prior violation of this title.
