- 19 DEPARTMENT'S ANNUAL BUDGET AN AMOUNT NOT EXCEEDING \$500,000 TO BE USED,
- 20 TOGETHER WITH EQUAL MATCHING FUNDS FROM THE PRIVATE SECTOR, TO FUND
- 21 THE COSTS OF THE MARYLAND MENTORING PARTNERSHIP.
- 22 (B) IF THE FULL EXTENT OF THE MATCHING FUNDS ARE NOT RECEIVED
