

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Board of Pilots shall report to the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Economic Matters Committee on or before October 1, 2002, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, on the implementation of the recommendations of the Department of Legislative Services contained in the sunset evaluation report dated October 2001. This report shall include:
