3 FOR the purpose of continuing the State Board of Pilots in accordance with the

- 4 provisions of the Maryland Program Evaluation Act (Sunset Law) by extending

- 6 authority of the Board; requiring the Board to pay certain moneys into the
- 7 General Fund of the State; providing that compensation of the Board and
- 8 reimbursement for expenses shall be as provided in the State budget; making
