5 FOR the purpose of increasing the annual salary of the State's Attorney for Prince

6 George's County beginning with a certain calendar year; altering the number of

7 assistant State's Attorney positions in the State's Attorney's office; increasing

8 the maximum salaries of the deputy State's Attorneys, the assistant State's

9 Attorneys, and the administrative assistant in the State's Attorney's office;

10 providing that this Act does not apply to the salary or compensation of the

11 incumbent State's Attorney; and generally relating to the composition of and

12 salaries in the office salary of the State's Attorney of Prince George's County.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

The State's Attorney may not engage in the private practice of law but may participate in the pro bono program administered by the Prince George's County Bar Foundation.

17 (2) The State's Attorney may appoint two deputy State's Attorneys and 18 [65]73 assistant State's Attorneys. The deputy State's Attorneys and assistant State's 19 Attorneys serve at the pleasure of the State's Attorney.

20 (3) The annual salary of the deputy State's Attorneys shall be within the 21 discretion of the State's Attorney, but may not exceed [\$97,000]\$108,000. The salaries 22 are to be paid by the County on the certification of the State's Attorney to the County 23 Executive and County Council.

(4) The annual salary of the assistant State's Attorneys shall be within
the discretion of the State's Attorney, but may not exceed [\$90,000]\$100,000. The
salaries are to be paid by the County on the certification of the State's Attorney to the
County Executive and County Council.

(5) The deputy State's Attorneys and the assistant State's Attorneys,
except in connection with their duties as deputy State's Attorneys and assistant
State's Attorneys, may not appear as counsel or represent any party professionally
before any court, board, commission or agency of this State or any county or political
subdivision of this State. The deputy State's Attorneys and assistant State's Attorneys
may not engage in the private practice of law, but may participate in the pro bono
program administered by the Prince George's County Bar Foundation.

35 (6) The deputy State's Attorneys and the assistant State's Attorneys
36 shall perform whatever work as may be directed by the State's Attorney, or as

1 authorized by law, and under the direction of the State's Attorney may present cases

2 to the grand juries, sign indictments and criminal informations, and perform

3 whatever other acts and duties in relation to the grand juries and in the operation of

4 the office as are necessary and proper.

5 (7) The State's Attorney may appoint an administrative assistant to 6 serve at the pleasure of the State's Attorney. The annual salary of the administrative 7 assistant shall be within the discretion of the State's Attorney, but may not exceed 8 [\$56,000]\$59,000. The salary is to be paid by the County on the certification of the 9 State's Attorney to the County Executive and County Council. The administrative 10 assistant is not subject to the rules and regulations of the County merit system, but 11 shall be entitled to all benefits provided for County employees under the merit 12 system.

13 (8) The salary and expenses of the State's Attorney, the deputy State's
14 Attorneys, and the assistant State's Attorneys shall be paid in equal semimonthly
15 installments.

16 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, pursuant to Article III, 17 Section 35 of the Constitution of Maryland, this Act may not be construed to extend or 18 apply to the salary or compensation of the State's Attorney for Prince George's County 19 in office on the effective date of this Act, but the provisions of this Act concerning the 20 salary or compensation of the State's Attorney for Prince George's County shall take 21 effect at the beginning of the next following term of office.

22 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 23 October 1, 2002.
