SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 23

The State Superintendent of Schools shall certify annually to the Administration those programs that continue to be areas of critical or geographic shortage as evidenced by projected employment vacancies substantially exceeding projected qualified graduates.
