### 1 AN ACT concerning

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## Nursing Homes - Quality of Care - Assisted Living Services

3 FOR the purpose of adding assisted living services to the Oversight Committee on

- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

2 Mental Hygiene shall submit a report to the Oversight Committee twice annually on 3 the implementation of the Task Force recommendations and the status of quality of

4 care in nursing homes.

5 (2) The reports shall be submitted on March 1 and September 1 of each 6 year.

7 (g) The Deputy Secretary of Health Care Financing shall report annually to
8 the Oversight Committee on the status of the Medicaid Nursing Home
9 Reimbursement System, which shall include but not be limited to:

10 (1) Elements of the existing methodology that are no longer relevant;

11 (2) Elements of the existing methodology that can be revised;

12 (3) The appropriateness of redesigning the system given changing 13 demographics of the target population; and

14 (4) General Fund and federal fund savings from a system redesign that 15 may be redirected to nursing home staff development in the nursing cost center.

(h) The Oversight Committee shall review the reports of the Office of Health
17 Care Quality and the Deputy Secretary of Health Care Financing and develop
18 recommendations to continue improvement in nursing home care.

19(I)(I)THE OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE SHALL EVALUATE REGULATIONS ON20ASSISTED LIVING PROGRAMS AND SERVICES, INCLUDING THE:

21 (I) ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATION;

22 (II) QUALIFICATIONS OF STAFF; AND

23 (III) NUMBER OF STAFF.

24 (2) BY FEBRUARY 2, 2003, THE OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE SHALL MAKE
25 RECOMMENDATIONS TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF CARE IN ASSISTED LIVING
26 SERVICES.

27 [(i)] (J) The Oversight Committee shall report its findings and 28 recommendations to the Governor and, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government

29 Article, to the General Assembly on or before December 1 of each year.

30 [(j)] (K) The Department of Aging, with assistance from the Department of 31 Health and Mental Hygiene and the Department of Legislative Services, shall provide 32 staff support for the Oversight Committee.

33 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect34 October 1, 2002.

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
