

- 1 (V) ANY INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION IN THE STATE 2 OFFERING A MASTER'S DEGREE IN NURSING.
- 3 (C) A GRADUATE AND PROFESSIONAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD FOR A SINGLE 4 SCHOOL YEAR MAY NOT BE LESS THAN \$1,000 OR MORE THAN \$5,000.
- 5 (D) A RECIPIENT MAY NOT RECEIVE AN AWARD FOR LONGER THAN 8 6 SEMESTERS.
- 7 (E) (1) THE COMMISSION SHALL ALLOCATE GRANTS FOR THE PROGRAM TO
- 8 THE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION SPECIFIED IN SUBSECTION (B)(3) OF THIS
- 9 SECTION BASED ON THE PROPORTION OF STATE RESIDENTS ENROLLED IN ELIGIBLE
- 10 PROGRAMS AT EACH INSTITUTION.
- 11 (2) AN INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION THAT RECEIVES A GRANT
- 12 UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL PROVIDE THE COMMISSION WITH AN ANNUAL AUDIT
- 13 DESCRIBING THE DISPOSITION OF THE FUNDS.
- 14 (F) THE COMMISSION SHALL:
- 15 (1) ESTABLISH GUIDELINES FOR THE AWARDING OF GRADUATE AND
- 16 PROFESSIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS BY THE INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION TO
- 17 THE STUDENTS; AND
- 18 (2) ADOPT REGULATIONS NECESSARY FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF
- 19 THIS SECTION.
- 20 (G) FUNDS FOR THE MARYLAND GRADUATE AND PROFESSIONAL PROGRAM
- 21 SHALL BE AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET AND AS SET FORTH IN § 13-613 OF
- 22 THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE.
- 23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:
- 24 (a) The State Department of Education shall review current pay for teachers
- 25 and school administrators and make recommendations regarding:
- 26 (1) implementation of a differential pay scale for teachers and school
- 27 administrators;
- 28 (2) optional 12-month contracts for teachers and school administrators;
- 29 (3) Maryland's financial incentives in relation to the financial incentives
- 30 offered in other states; and
- 31 (4) targeting financial incentives to the recruitment and retention of
- 32 teachers and school administrators.
- 33 (b) The State Department of Education shall provide a final report of its
- 34 findings and recommendations to the Governor and, in accordance with § 2 1246 of
- 35 the State Government Article, to the General Assembly by January 1, 2003.

- 1 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That it is the intent of the
- 2 General Assembly that the Governor shall include in the State budget for fiscal year
- 3 2003 an appropriation of at least \$2,730,000 for the Maryland Professional
- 4 Development Program in § 6-801 of the Education Article as enacted in this Act.
- 5 SECTION 4. 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
- 6 General Assembly that the Governor shall include in the State budget for fiscal year
- 7 2003 an appropriation of at least \$476,000 in an amount sufficient to fund the
- 8 provisions of § 7-203.1 of the Education Article, as enacted in this Act, for the
- 9 administration of the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test to every 10th grade
- 10 student students in the State. The Governor shall include an appropriation in the
- 11 State budget for fiscal year 2004 and each subsequent fiscal year in an amount
- 12 sufficient to fund the provisions of § 7-203.1 of the Education Article, as enacted in
- 13 this Act.
- 14 SECTION 5. 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
- 15 General Assembly that:
- 16 (a) The K-16 Leadership Council shall be formalized through a Memorandum
- 17 of Understanding signed by the State Superintendent of Schools, the Secretary of
- 18 Higher Education, the Chancellor of the University System of Maryland, and private
- 19 colleges and universities.
- 20 (b) <u>If funding is provided in the State budget, the The K-16 Leadership</u>
- 21 Council shall establish study and plan for the establishment of the K-16 Research
- 22 and Development Institute and the Maryland Clearinghouse for Educational
- 23 Statistics.
- 24 SECTION 6. 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
- 25 General Assembly that the State Department of Education develop, in conjunction
- 26 with the Professional Standards and Teacher Education Board, a certificate for
- 27 middle school teachers.
- 28 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That it is the intent of the
- 29 General Assembly that the Governor include sufficient funds in the State budget of
- 30 the Maryland Higher Education Commission to provide awards to all students
- 31 eligible for need based programs under §§ 18 301, 18 706(d), 18 1401, 18 1501, and
- 32 18-2601 of the Education Article and § 13-613(d)(1) of the Transportation Article.
- 33 SECTION 8. 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
- 34 General Assembly that:
- 35 (a) The College Readiness Outreach Program established in § 18-303.1 of the
- 36 Education Article in this Act be implemented over a 5-year period beginning in fiscal
- 37 2003 2004, to the extent that funds are available;
- 38 (b) The Governor shall include an appropriation of at least \$1.2 million in the
- 39 State budget in fiscal 2003 for the Maryland Higher Education Commission and the
- 40 State Department of Education for a pilot of the College Readiness Outreach Program

- 1 for up to 1,000 students in Allegany, Prince George's, and Wicomico counties and
- 2 Baltimore City; and
- 3 (b) In the first year of implementation, to the extent that funds are available,
- 4 the Maryland Higher Education Commission and the State Department of Education
- 5 shall implement the College Readiness Outreach Program for up to 1,000 students in
- 6 Allegany, Prince George's, and Wicomico counties and Baltimore City; and
- 7 (c) As funds are provided in the State budget, additional counties shall be
- 8 added to the College Readiness Outreach Program until students from all counties in
- 9 Maryland are participating in the Program.
- 10 SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
- 11 General Assembly that the Governor include \$3 million in the State budget in fiscal
- 12 2003 to implement Education Excellence Awards to be made by institutions of higher
- 13 education in the State established under § 18-307(d) of the Education Article.
- 14 SECTION 10. 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any reference in the
- 15 Annotated Code rendered obsolete by this Act shall be corrected by the publisher of
- 16 the Annotated Code, in consultation with and subject to the approval of the
- 17 Department of Legislative Services, with no further action required by the General
- 18 Assembly. The publisher of the Annotated Code shall adequately describe any such
- 19 correction in an editor's note following the section affected.
- 20 SECTION 11. 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 21 effect July 1, 2002.
