8 applicant for a scholarship for which financial need is a consideration; and

29 so, provide evidence satisfactory to the [State Scholarship Administration] OFFICE of
30 extenuating circumstances;

31 (3) Be under the age of 22 years at the time of receiving the first award;

32 (4) Have successfully completed a college preparatory program in high
33 school;

34 (5) Enroll in college as a full-time student;

1 (6) Have an annual family income below a poverty index determined by
2 the Commission; and

3 (7) Satisfy any additional criteria the Commission may establish.

4 (D) A STUDENT IN GRADE 9 OR GRADE 10 WHO APPLIES AND QUALIFIES FOR A
5 GUARANTEED ACCESS GRANT AWARD ON THE BASIS OF FINANCIAL NEED AS
6 ESTABLISHED BY THE COMMISSION SHALL PREQUALIFY FOR A GUARANTEED
7 ACCESS AWARD TO BE USED AT THE TIME OF ENROLLMENT IN AN INSTITUTION OF

9 UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT, TO:

12 (3) PROVIDE INFORMATION REQUIRED BY THE COMMISSION OR THE
13 STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION;

14 (4) COMPLETE AND FILE ON A TIMELY BASIS APPLICATIONS FOR
15 FEDERAL STUDENT AID FOR EACH YEAR THAT THE STUDENT PLANS TO ENROLL IN

7 SUPERINTENDENTS TO PROVIDE GUIDANCE AND ONE-ON-ONE MENTORING TO
8 PARTICIPATING STUDENTS IN HIGH SCHOOL; AND

9 (II) PUBLICIZE THE PROGRAM THROUGH COMMUNITY OUTREACH
10 AND MARKETING MATERIALS.

11 (E) THE COMMISSION AND THE DEPARTMENT MAY ENTER INTO AGREEMENTS
12 WITH EXISTING ORGANIZATIONS THAT PROVIDE COUNSELING AND MENTORING
13 SERVICES TO FULFILL THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION.

14 (F) THE COMMISSION AND THE DEPARTMENT MAY SUPPLEMENT

34 Award based on the financial need of the applicant.

36 OFFICE shall consider regional cost-of-living differences.

2 Educational Excellence Award may be awarded in \$100 increments and the award for
3 a single year may not be less than \$400 or more than \$3,000.

11 (a) An Educational Excellence Award may be used:

12 (1) At a degree granting institution of higher education, an eligible
13 institution with an associate degree program that provides transfer credit for an
14 accredited baccalaureate program, or a hospital diploma school for training registered
15 nurses if the curriculum is approved by the Commission; and

16 (2) For educational expenses as defined by the Commission, including:

17 (i) Tuition and fees; and

18 (ii) Room and board.

19 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, an Educational
20 Excellence Award may be used at a school in another state if:

21 (1) There is a reciprocal agreement as provided in § 18-308 of this
22 subtitle; and

23 (2) The school meets requirements of subsection (a)(1) of this section.

24 (c) The [Administration] OFFICE may not award more than 10% of the funds
25 available for each of the types of grants awarded under this subtitle for use by
26 students attending schools in another state.

28 (a) Subject to the provisions of subsection (d) of this section, each recipient of
29 an Educational Excellence Award may hold the award for 5 years if the recipient:

30 (1) Continues to be a resident of this State;

31 (2) Continues to be a full-time student at an eligible institution and
32 takes at least 12 semester hours of courses each semester, or its equivalent as
33 determined by the [Administration] OFFICE;

1 (3) In the judgment of the institution, is making satisfactory progress
2 toward a degree; and

3 (4) Maintains the standards of the institution.

4 (b) Each recipient of an Educational Excellence Award who is enrolled in an
5 associate degree program as permitted in § 18-303(b)(1) of this subtitle may hold the
6 award for 3 years if the same conditions of subsection (a) of this section are met.

7 (c) Each recipient of an Educational Excellence Award may hold the award for
8 a 5th year if the recipient:

9 (1) Is enrolled in an academic program that, as determined by the
10 institution, requires 5 years to complete; or

11 (2) Provides evidence, satisfactory to the [State Scholarship
12 Administration] OFFICE, of extenuating financial, academic, or other circumstances
13 that prevent the recipient from completing the academic program in 4 years.

14 (d) In addition to the requirements for renewal of an Educational Excellence
15 Award under subsections (a), (b), and (c) of this section, a recipient of a Guaranteed
16 Access Grant shall hold the grant for not more than 5 consecutive years or, failing to
17 do so, provide evidence satisfactory to the [State Scholarship Administration]
18 OFFICE of extenuating circumstances.
