A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Safety - Mandatory Supervision - Credit for Time on Release**

3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting an inmate from receiving credit for time between  
4 release on mandatory supervision and revocation of mandatory supervision if  
5 the inmate was serving a sentence for certain crimes when mandatory  
6 supervision was revoked and the mandatory supervision was revoked due to a  
7 finding that the inmate committed a certain crime under certain circumstances;  
8 providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to mandatory  
9 supervision.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 **Article - Correctional Services**

18 7-504.

19 (a) The commissioner presiding at an individual's mandatory supervision  
20 revocation hearing may revoke any or all of the diminution credits previously earned  
21 by the individual on the individual's term of confinement.

22 (b) An inmate may not be awarded any new diminution credits after the  
23 inmate's mandatory supervision has been revoked.

24 (C) AN INMATE MAY NOT RECEIVE CREDIT FOR TIME BETWEEN RELEASE ON  
25 MANDATORY SUPERVISION AND REVOCATION OF MANDATORY SUPERVISION IF:

26 (1) THE INMATE WAS SERVING A SENTENCE FOR A VIOLENT CRIME  
27 WHEN MANDATORY SUPERVISION WAS REVOKED; AND

1           (2)       MANDATORY SUPERVISION WAS REVOKED DUE TO A FINDING THAT  
2 THE INMATE WAS CONVICTED OF A VIOLENT CRIME WHILE ON MANDATORY  
3 SUPERVISION.

4       SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be  
5 construed to apply only prospectively to inmates on mandatory supervision who  
6 commit crimes on or after the effective date of this Act and may not be applied or  
7 interpreted to have any effect on or application to inmates on mandatory supervision  
8 who commit crimes before the effective date of this Act.

9       SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
10 October 1, 2002.
