1 2	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
3	Article - Health Occupations

5 6	(a) In addition to the powers set forth elsewhere in this title, the Board may adopt rules and regulations to carry out the provisions of this title.
7	(b) In addition to the duties set forth elsewhere in this title, the Board shall:
8 9	(1) Establish procedures for receiving and investigating complaints, including:
12	(i) Providing notice to the licensed psychologist that a complaint has been filed against the licensed psychologist and forwarding a copy of the complaint to the licensed psychologist within [60] 120 days of receipt of the complaint, unless the Board:
	1. Makes an affirmative determination that the disclosure would prejudice the investigation of the complaint and notifies the licensee of the determination; or
17 18	2. Disposes of the complaint within [60] 120 days of the date of receipt of the complaint; and
19 20	(ii) Notifying, at least every 3 months, the licensed psychologist and the complainant as to the status of any outstanding complaint;
21 22	(2) Submit an annual report of its activities to the Secretary as soon as practicable after the end of each fiscal year; and
23	(3) Adopt an official seal.

	(a) Except as provided in this section for an action under § 18-313 of this subtitle, any person aggrieved by a final decision of the Board in a contested case, as defined in the Administrative Procedure Act, may:
28	(1) Appeal that decision to the Board of Review; and
29 30	(2) Then take any further appeal allowed by the Administrative Procedure Act.
	(b) (1) Any person aggrieved by a final decision of the Board under § 18-313 of this subtitle may not appeal to the Secretary or Board of Review but may take a direct judicial appeal.

- 1 (2) The appeal shall be made as provided for judicial review of final 2 decisions in the Administrative Procedure Act.
- 3 (c) A decision of the Board to deny A LICENSE, ACTUALLY suspend ENFORCE A
 4 SUSPENSION OF A LICENSE FOR MORE THAN 1 YEAR, or revoke a license may not be
- 5 stayed pending judicial review.
