A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Natural Resources - Hunting Licenses - Resident and Nonresident

- 3 FOR the purpose of repealing provisions of law relating to certain hunting licenses;
- 4 providing for certain senior and junior hunting licenses; altering the fees for
- 5 certain hunting stamps and licenses; altering the amount of compensation
- 6 provided to certain agents for issuing certain hunting stamps and licenses;
- 7 making a stylistic change; and generally relating to resident and nonresident
- 8 hunting licenses.
- 9 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

- Section 10-301(f) and (g), 10-301.1(g), 10-302, 10-308, 10-308.1(a) and (e), and
- 12 10-415(c) and (d)

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 Article - Natural Resources

- 18 10-301.
- 19 (f) There shall be the following types of hunting licenses in the State:
- 20 (i) [A resident consolidated hunting license that enables the
- 21 purchaser to hunt all legal game birds and mammals during any appropriate season
- 22 in Maryland without the purchase of additional stamps, except that to hunt wild
- 23 waterfowl the purchaser must also buy a Maryland migratory wild waterfowl stamp
- 24 and a federal migratory bird hunting and conservation stamp.
- 25 (ii) A resident basic hunting license that enables the purchaser to
- 26 hunt all legal game birds and mammals during any appropriate season without the
- 27 purchase of additional stamps unless the purchaser is hunting deer or wild waterfowl.
- 28 This license enables the purchaser to hunt deer only with the purchase of the

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- 1 appropriate deer stamps and to hunt wild waterfowl only with the purchase of a
- 2 Maryland migratory wild waterfowl stamp and a federal migratory bird hunting and
- 3 conservation stamp.
- 4 [(iii)] (II) A nonresident basic hunting license that enables the
- 5 purchaser to hunt all legal game birds and mammals during any appropriate season
- 6 without the purchase of additional stamps unless the purchaser is hunting wild
- 7 waterfowl or deer during bow and arrow season or black powder season. This license
- 8 enables the purchaser to hunt wild waterfowl only with the purchase of a Maryland
- 9 migratory wild waterfowl stamp and a federal migratory bird hunting and
- 10 conservation stamp. This license enables the purchaser to hunt deer during bow and
- 11 arrow season and black powder season only with the purchase of the appropriate deer
- 12 stamp.
- 13 [(iv)] (III) A nonresident 3-day hunting license that enables the
- 14 purchaser to hunt all legal game birds and mammals except deer and turkey for the
- 15 3 consecutive legal hunting days in a single season that are specified on the license by
- 16 the issuing agent. The purchaser must also purchase a Maryland migratory wild
- 17 waterfowl stamp and a federal migratory bird hunting and conservation stamp to
- 18 hunt wild waterfowl with this license. Under no circumstance does this license
- 19 authorize the purchaser to hunt deer and turkey.
- 20 (IV) A JUNIOR RESIDENT CONSOLIDATED HUNTING LICENSE, FOR A
- 21 RESIDENT UNDER THE AGE OF 16 YEARS, THAT ENABLES THE PURCHASER TO HUNT
- 22 ALL LEGAL GAME BIRDS AND MAMMALS DURING ANY APPROPRIATE SEASON IN
- 23 MARYLAND WITHOUT THE PURCHASE OF ADDITIONAL STAMPS, EXCEPT THAT TO
- 24 HUNT WILD WATERFOWL THE PURCHASER MUST ALSO BUY A MARYLAND
- 25 MIGRATORY WILD WATERFOWL STAMP AND A FEDERAL MIGRATORY BIRD HUNTING
- 26 AND CONSERVATION STAMP.
- 27 (V) A SENIOR RESIDENT CONSOLIDATED HUNTING LICENSE, FOR A
- 28 RESIDENT THAT HAS ATTAINED THE AGE OF 65, THAT ENABLES THE PURCHASER TO
- 29 HUNT ALL LEGAL GAME BIRDS AND MAMMALS DURING ANY APPROPRIATE SEASON
- 30 IN MARYLAND WITHOUT THE PURCHASE OF ADDITIONAL STAMPS, EXCEPT THAT TO
- 31 HUNT WILD WATERFOWL THE PURCHASER MUST ALSO BUY A MARYLAND
- 32 MIGRATORY WILD WATERFOWL STAMP AND A FEDERAL MIGRATORY BIRD HUNTING
- 33 AND CONSERVATION STAMP.
- 34 (2) Residents may purchase a senior consolidated license beginning in
- 35 the calendar year in which they attain the age of 65, which shall be valid for the
- 36 remainder of the purchaser's life.
- 37 (3) Residents may purchase a senior consolidated annual license
- 38 beginning in the calendar year in which they attain the age of 65.
- 39 (4) A nonresident of any age must purchase either a nonresident basic
- 40 hunting license or a nonresident 3-day hunting license to hunt in the State.
- 41 (5) The fees for hunting licenses are according to the following schedule:

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

8 (g) The person designated to sell the hunting licenses and individual hunting 9 stamps shall issue the hunting licenses and individual hunting stamps and collect the 10 fee prescribed in subsection (f) of this section. A hunting license may not be issued to 11 any person under the age of 16 years without the written consent of the person's 12 parent or guardian. The Department shall furnish the hunting licenses and 13 individual hunting stamps to the designated person. The issuing person shall 14 countersign the license, and retain the duplicate copy of the license. The duplicate 15 copies and money collected every month shall be mailed to the Department on the 16 first day of the succeeding month each year. The designated person who sells and 17 issues the hunting licenses and individual hunting stamps shall retain as 18 compensation [50 cents] \$1.00 for each [senior consolidated annual license,] senior 19 consolidated lifetime license, resident and nonresident basic, or nonresident 3-day 19 hunting license, and 50 CENTS FOR EACH individual hunting stamp sold and issued 19 [and shall retain as compensation \$1 for each consolidated hunting license sold and 19 issued, except a senior consolidated annual license and a senior consolidated lifetime 10 license].

- 2 (a) Any person engaged in a retail business who desires to sell resident or
- 3 nonresident basic hunting licenses, [consolidated hunting licenses,] nonresident
- 4 3-day hunting licenses, or individual hunting stamps as an agent under the
- 5 Department's control and supervision shall apply to the Department on forms
- 6 prepared and prescribed by the Department. The Department may furnish resident
- 7 and nonresident basic hunting licenses, [consolidated hunting licenses,] nonresident
- $8\,$ 3-day hunting licenses, and individual hunting stamps on consignment to any agent
- 9 who provides a bond or other security deemed sufficient and adequate by the
- 10 Department to insure payment for the resident and nonresident basic hunting
- 11 licenses, consolidated hunting licenses, nonresident 3-day hunting licenses, and
- 12 individual hunting stamps.
- 13 (b) (1) The agent shall fill out every license and duplicate license in a legible
- 14 and proper manner.
- 15 (2) The agent shall date and affix any deer, bow and arrow, or black
- 16 powder stamp purchased on a basic hunting license in accordance with § 10-308 of
- 17 this subtitle.
- 18 (3) The agent shall submit any necessary report of sale together with the
- 19 duplicate license after the first day of each month as long as the agent sells these
- 20 licenses in accordance with § 10-301 of this subtitle. The report and duplicate licenses
- 21 shall reach the Department by the seventh day of each succeeding month.
- 22 (4) The Department shall reimburse any agent not operating on
- 23 consignment the sum paid for unissued resident and nonresident basic hunting
- 24 licenses, [consolidated hunting licenses,] nonresident 3-day hunting licenses, and
- 25 individual hunting stamps provided they are returned intact, and still attached in the
- 26 issuing books by June 30 of each year, and have been checked and found to be correct
- 27 by the Department. Every hunting license and individual hunting stamp not returned
- 28 by June 30 shall be deemed sold and not reimbursable unless accompanied by a
- 29 statement under oath stating why the hunting license or individual hunting stamp is
- 30 returned late. The Department, after review, may reimburse the agent.
- 31 (c) A designated person may not make any false statement concerning any
- 32 date of issuance or other resident or nonresident basic hunting license, [consolidated
- 33 hunting license,] nonresident 3-day hunting license, or individual hunting stamp
- 34 data. Every hunting license book, duplicate individual hunting license, or individual
- 35 hunting stamp shall be available for any law enforcement officer to inspect at any
- 36 time during the regular business day. An agent may not issue any hunting license or
- 37 individual hunting stamp without receiving the fees required by law. A receipt may
- 38 not be issued in lieu of a hunting license or individual hunting stamp.
- 39 (d) In addition to any other penalty provided for by the provisions of this title,
- 40 any agent convicted of violating the provisions of this section shall have the agent's
- 41 hunting license and individual hunting stamp issuing privilege rescinded.



Each individual hunting stamp shall be affixed in the manner that the Department provides. The recipient shall sign the consolidated hunting license or resident or nonresident basic hunting license in ink.

31	(a) In addition to the [consolidated hunting license,] nonresident 3-day hunting license[,] or resident or nonresident basic hunting license, a person hunting wild waterfowl in the State first shall obtain a Maryland migratory wild waterfowl stamp.					
35	(e) The Maryland migratory wild waterfowl stamp shall be affixed to the [consolidated hunting license,] nonresident 3-day hunting license[,] or resident and nonresident basic hunting license of the person to whom the stamp is issued. The recipient shall sign the stamp in ink.
