SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 16 provision takes effect, Section 1 of this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force
- 17 and effect. This Act may not be interpreted to have any effect on that termination

- 21 an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
- 22 health or safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of
- 23 all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly and,
- 24 except as provided in Section 4 of this Act, shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
