2 **Department of General Services - Procurements on Behalf of Private**
3 **Schools**

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Department of General Services to purchase
5 materials, supplies, and equipment on behalf of certain private elementary and
6 secondary schools; clarifying that the Department of General Services has the
7 authority to purchase materials, supplies, and equipment on behalf of certain
8 nonpublic institutions of higher education; ~~providing that this Act does not~~
9 ~~authorize~~ prohibiting the Department of General Services ~~to purchase from~~
10 purchasing religious materials on behalf of a private elementary or secondary
11 school or nonpublic institutions of higher education; and generally relating to
12 the authority of the Department of General Services to purchase materials,
13 supplies, and equipment for certain schools.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article 41 - Governor - Executive and Administrative Departments**

2 18-201.

3 (a) Subject to the initial approval of the Secretary of General Services, the
4 services of the Purchasing Bureau of the Department of General Services may be used
5 to purchase materials, supplies, and equipment by the county commissioners or the
6 appropriate purchasing entity for:

7 (1) A county or Baltimore City;

8 (2) A municipal corporation;

9 (3) A governmental agency in the State;

10 (4) A public or quasi-public agency that:

11 (i) Receives State money; and

12 (ii) Is exempt from taxation under § 501(c)(3) of the Internal
13 Revenue Code;

14 (5) A PRIVATE ELEMENTARY OR SECONDARY SCHOOL THAT:

15 (I) EITHER HAS BEEN ISSUED A CERTIFICATE OF APPROVAL FROM
16 THE STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION OR IS ACCREDITED BY THE ASSOCIATION OF
17 INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS; AND18 (II) IS EXEMPT FROM TAXATION UNDER § 501(C)(3) OF THE
19 INTERNAL REVENUE CODE; OR20 (6) A NONPUBLIC INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION UNDER § 17-106
21 OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE.

22 (b) The right to purchase through the Department of General Services under
23 subsection (a) of this section shall be in addition to, but not in substitution for, the
24 applicable purchasing power granted to any county, municipal corporation, the Mayor
25 and City Council of Baltimore, any other governmental agency in this State, or any
26 public or quasi-public agency pursuant to any statutory or charter provision.
