Maryland Home Household Goods Movers Act

3 FOR the purpose of requiring home movers to provide consumers with certain

4 information under certain circumstances; requiring home movers to provide

5 consumers with written estimates under certain circumstances; requiring a

6 home mover's written estimate to contain certain information; prohibiting a

7 home mover from exercising or threatening to exercise a warehouseman's lien or

8 from refusing to deliver consumer goods prohibiting a household goods mover

9 <u>from enforcing a carrier's lien or refusing to deliver certain household goods</u>

10 under certain circumstances; providing that a violation of this subtitle is an

11 unfair and deceptive trade practice subject to certain enforcement and penalty

12 provisions; providing that a household goods mover who violates this subtitle is

13 <u>subject to certain civil and criminal penalties under certain circumstances;</u>

14 *making a certain conforming change; requiring the Division of Consumer*

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Commercial Law

22 <u>7-308.</u>

23 (1) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN § 14-2902 OF THIS ARTICLE, A carrier's lien

24 may be enforced by public or private sale of the goods, in bloc or in parcels, at any time

25 or place and on any terms which are commercially reasonable, after notifying all

26 persons known to claim an interest in the goods. Such notification must include a

27 statement of the amount due, the nature of the proposed sale and the time and place of

28 any public sale. The fact that a better price could have been obtained by a sale at a

29 <u>different time or in a different method from that selected by the carrier is not of itself</u>

30 <u>sufficient to establish that the sale was not made in a commercially reasonable</u>

31 manner. If the carrier either sells the goods in the usual manner in any recognized
 32 market therefor or if he sells at the price current in such market at the time of his sale

33 or if he has otherwise sold in conformity with commercially reasonable practices

34 among dealers in the type of goods sold he has sold in a commercially reasonable

35 manner. A sale of more goods than apparently necessary to be offered to ensure

36 satisfaction of the obligation is not commercially reasonable except in cases covered by

37 *the preceding sentence.*

	(C) IF A HOME MOVER AGREES TO PROVIDE HOME MOVING SERVICES TO A CONSUMER, THE HOME MOVER SHALL PROVIDE THE CONSUMER WITH A WRITTEN ESTIMATE PRIOR TO THE SCHEDULING OF THE MOVE.		

1 (D) A WRITTEN ESTIMATE SHALL:

2 (1) SEPARATELY IDENTIFY EACH MOVING SERVICE THAT THE HOME
3 MOVER IS OFFERING TO THE CONSUMER, THE PRICE OF THE SERVICE, AND THE
4 METHOD OF CALCULATING THE PRICE OF THE SERVICE;

5 (2) SEPARATELY IDENTIFY ANY FEE THAT THE CONSUMER WILL OR MAY 6 BE REQUIRED TO PAY;

7 (3) STATE THE ESTIMATED TOTAL PRICE;

8 (4) CONTAIN, IN CLOSE PROXIMITY TO THE ESTIMATED TOTAL PRICE, A 9 CONSPICUOUS NOTICE STATING:

10 "A HOME MOVER MAY NOT REFUSE TO DELIVER A CONSUMER'S GOODS IF THE 11 CONSUMER OFFERS TO PAY THE LESSER OF:

12 (I) THE OUTSTANDING BALANCE OF THE FINAL TOTAL PRICE 13 DEMANDED BY THE HOME MOVER; OR

14 (II) THE OUTSTANDING BALANCE OF 110 PERCENT OF THE 15 ESTIMATED TOTAL PRICE STATED IN THE WRITTEN ESTIMATE.";

16(5)STATE THE TIME AND METHOD OF PAYMENT REQUIRED OR17 ALLOWED;

18 (6) STATE THE SCHEDULED DATES OF PICKUP AND DELIVERY;

19(7)DESCRIBE THE COMPENSATION A CONSUMER WILL RECEIVE FOR20ANY LOSS OR DAMAGE TO THE CONSUMER'S GOODS;

21 (8) STATE THAT ANY CLAIM MADE BY A CONSUMER AGAINST A HOME

22 MOVER FOR LOSS OR DAMAGE TO THE CONSUMER'S GOODS MAY BE FILED UP TO

23 NINE MONTHS FROM THE DELIVERY OF THE GOODS; AND

24 (9) HAVE ATTACHED A COPY OF ANY CONTRACT, ORDER FOR SERVICE,

25 OR OTHER DOCUMENT THAT THE CONSUMER WILL BE ASKED TO SIGN OR THAT

26 DESCRIBES THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE MOVE.

28 A HOME MOVER MAY NOT EXERCISE OR THREATEN TO EXERCISE A

29 WAREHOUSEMAN'S LIEN OR OTHERWISE REFUSE TO DELIVER A CONSUMER'S 30 GOODS. UNLESS:

31 (1) A WRITTEN ESTIMATE WAS PROVIDED TO THE CONSUMER IN
 32 ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBTITLE; AND

33(2)THE CONSUMER FAILS TO TENDER TO THE HOME MOVER THE34LESSER OF:

1(I)THE OUTSTANDING BALANCE OF THE FINAL TOTAL PRICE2DEMANDED BY THE HOME MOVER; OR

3(II)THE OUTSTANDING BALANCE OF 110 PERCENT OF THE4ESTIMATED TOTAL PRICE STATED IN THE WRITTEN ESTIMATE.

5 <u>A HOUSEHOLD GOODS MOVER MAY NOT ENFORCE OR THREATEN TO ENFORCE</u>

7 GOODS WHEN PROVIDING HOUSEHOLD GOODS MOVING SERVICES FOR AN

(A) A VIOLATION OF ANY PROVISION OF THIS SUBTITLE IS AN UNFAIR OR
 DECEPTIVE TRADE PRACTICE WITHIN THE MEANING OF TITLE 13 OF THIS ARTICLE
 AND IS SUBJECT TO THE ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTY PROVISIONS CONTAINED IN
 TITLE 13 OF THIS ARTICLE.

14 (B) IN ADDITION TO BEING SUBJECT TO THE ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTY
 15 PROVISIONS CONTAINED IN TITLE 13 OF THIS ARTICLE, A HOUSEHOLD GOODS
 16 MOVER THAT VIOLATES THIS SUBTITLE IS SUBJECT TO ANY OTHER CIVIL OR
 17 CRIMINAL ACTION PROVIDED BY LAW.

19 THIS SUBTITLE MAY BE CITED AS THE MARYLAND HOME HOUSEHOLD GOODS20 MOVERS ACT.

21 <u>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED</u>, That on or before December 1,

22 2003, the Division of Consumer Protection of the Office of the Attorney General shall

23 report, in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the Senate

24 Finance Committee and the House Economic Matters Committee on:

25 (a) the need for a registration process for household goods movers, including 26 the persons subject to registration;

27 (b) the number of complaints received under this Act; and

28 (c) any enforcement action taken under this Act.

29 SECTION 2. <u>3.</u> AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take 30 effect October 1, 2002.

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
