1 (X) ONE MEMBER FROM THE MARYLAND LAND TRUST ALLIANCE. TO THE EXTENT PRACTICABLE, THE GOVERNOR SHALL ATTEMPT TO 2 (C) 3 ENSURE REGIONAL, ECONOMIC, ETHNIC, AND GENDER DIVERSITY ON THE TASK 4 FORCE. THE GOVERNOR SHALL DESIGNATE ONE MEMBER OF THE TASK FORCE AS (D) 6 CHAIRMAN. A MEMBER OF THE TASK FORCE MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION AS A 7 (E) 8 MEMBER BUT IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE 9 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET. - 1 (H) ON OR BEFORE JUNE 1, 2004, THE TASK FORCE SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT 2 OF ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR AND, SUBJECT TO § 3 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.
- 4 (I) THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND THE DEPARTMENT OF 5 PLANNING SHALL COORDINATE WITH OTHER STATE UNITS TO PROVIDE STAFF FOR 6 THE TASK FORCE.
- 7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to the approval
- 8 of the Governor, the same 18 members designated or appointed to serve on the Task
- 9 Force to Study the Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation in
- 10 accordance with Chapter 634 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2000
- 11 automatically qualify to serve on the Task Force created by this Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 13 June 1, 2002. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of May
- 14 31, 2004, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
- 15 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
