Except as otherwise provided in this title, [a person] AN INDIVIDUAL may not [practice]:

24 (1) PRACTICE, attempt to practice, or offer to practice as a nursing home 25 administrator in this State unless licensed by the Board; OR

26 (2) SUPERVISE, DIRECT, INDUCE, OR AID AN UNLICENSED INDIVIDUAL 27 TO PRACTICE AS A NURSING HOME ADMINISTRATOR.

HOUSE BILL 847

1 (a) On or before December 15 of the 2nd year before the evaluation date of a

2 governmental activity or unit, the Legislative Policy Committee, based on a

3 preliminary evaluation, may waive as unnecessary the evaluation required under this

4 section.

5 (b) Except as otherwise provided in subsection (a) of this section, on or before 6 the evaluation date for the following governmental activities or units, an evaluation 7 shall be made of the following governmental activities or units and the statutes and 8 regulations that relate to the governmental activities or units:

9 (43) Nursing Home Administrators, State Board of Examiners of (§ 9-201 10 of the Health Occupations Article: July 1, [2002] 2012);

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Maryland Board of

12 Nursing Home Administrators shall report to the Senate Finance Committee and the

13 House Environmental Matters Committee on or before October 1, 2002, in accordance

14 with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, on the implementation of the

15 recommendations of the Department of Legislative Services contained in the sunset 16 evaluation report dated October 2001.

17 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Maryland Board of

18 Nursing Home Administrators shall report to the Senate Finance Committee and the

19 House Environmental Matters Committee on or before October 1, 2003, on

20 recommendations of the Board for the Administrator-in-Training program. The

21 report should include an evaluation of: (1) the appropriate length of time for an

22 Administrator-in-Training program; (2) giving more credit for related experience or

23 appropriate education; (3) whether an Administrator-in-Training can train in a

24 facility with 75 beds or less; and (4) how an Administrator-in-Training program can

25 incorporate more quality of care training.

26 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 27 July 1, 2002.

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
