

AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the 18 General Assembly that if the Governor does not include in the State budget for fiscal year 2003 an appropriation for the Baltimore City public schools Public School 20 System in an amount sufficient to fund the recommendations in the 2002 Final Report 21 of the Commission on Education Finance, Equity, and Excellence as applicable to 22 Baltimore City, then the Governor shall include in the State budget for fiscal year 23 2003, if funds are available, an appropriation for the Baltimore City public schools of 24 at least \$50,000,000 for the Baltimore City-State Partnership, as provided in Section 25 7 of Chapter 105 of the Acts of 1997, as amended by Chapter 420 of the Acts of 2001, 26 and \$55,000,000 toward the Remedy Plan of the Baltimore City Public School System, 27 including \$20,465,079 as provided in Section 4 of Chapter 493 of the Acts of 2000, as 28 amended by Chapter 420 of the Acts of 2001 requirements of Chapter 29 the Acts of the General Assembly of 2002 as applicable to Baltimore City, the Governor 30 shall include in the State budget for fiscal year 2003 an appropriation for the 31 Baltimore City Public School System that includes at least: (1) \$50,000,000 for the 32 Baltimore City-State Partnership as required by Section 7 of Chapter 105 of the Acts 33 of the General Assembly of 1997, as amended by Chapter 420 of the Acts of the General 34 Assembly of 2001; (2) \$20,465,079 for the Remedy Plan for the Baltimore City Public

35 <u>School System as required by Section 4 of Chapter 493 of the Acts of the General</u>
 36 <u>Assembly of 2000, as amended by Chapter 420 of the Acts of the General Assembly of</u>
 37 2001; and (3) an additional \$31,380,534 for the Remedy Plan for the Baltimore City

38 Public School System.

- 1 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if the Governor does not
- 2 include in the State budget for fiscal years 2004 through 2007 2008 an appropriation
- 3 for the Baltimore City Public Schools School System in an amount sufficient to fund
- 4 the recommendations in the 2002 Final Report of the Commission on Education
- 5 Finance, Equity, and Excellence as applicable to Baltimore City, then the Governor
- 6 shall include in the State budget for fiscal years 2004 through 2007, in each year if
- 7 funds are available, an appropriation for the Baltimore City Public Schools of at least
- 8 \$50,000,000 for the Baltimore City State Partnership and \$55,000,000 toward the
- 9 Remedy Plan of the Baltimore City Public School System requirements of Chapter
- 10 (S.B. 856) of the Acts of the General Assembly of 2002 as applicable to Baltimore City,
- 11 the Governor shall include in the State budgets for fiscal years 2004 through 2008, in
- 12 <u>each year, an appropriation for the Baltimore City Public School System that includes</u>
- 13 at least: (1) \$50,000,000 for the Baltimore City-State Partnership; and (2) \$55,000,000
- 14 for the Remedy Plan for the Baltimore City Public School System.
- 15 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That if the Governor does not
- 16 include in the State budget for fiscal years 2003 through 2007 2008 an appropriation
- 17 for the Baltimore City public schools Public School System in an amount sufficient to
- 18 fund the recommendations in the 2002 Final Report of the Commission on Education
- 19 Finance, Equity, and Excellence requirements of Chapter ___ (S.B. 856) of the Acts of
- 20 the General Assembly of 2002 as applicable to Baltimore City, then if any new source
- 21 of revenue becomes available to the State during fiscal years 2003 through 2007 2008,
- 22 and such revenue is dedicated in whole or in part to education generally, the
- 23 Baltimore City public schools shall receive its designated share of those revenues
- 24 without reduction of the additional funds provided under Sections 3 and 4 Sections 2
- 25 and 3 of this Act. Nothing in this Act, however, shall prevent the Governor or the
- 26 General Assembly from reducing local aid to Baltimore City as part of any general
- 27 statewide reduction in local aid for a special project or purpose.
- 28 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before December 1,
- 29 2006, a consultant shall conduct a comprehensive review and evaluation of the
- 30 Baltimore City-State Partnership and the reform initiatives of the Baltimore City
- 31 Public School System. The Board of School Commissioners and the Maryland State
- 32 Board of Education shall jointly select and equally share the cost of the consultant
- 33 and determine the scope of the review. The Board of School Commissioners and the
- 34 State Board shall review the findings of the comprehensive review and shall conduct
- 35 four public hearings throughout Baltimore City. On or before January 15, 2007, the
- 36 Board of School Commissioners and the State Board shall report to the General
- 37 Assembly the results of the public hearings and the review of the comprehensive
- 38 evaluation and propose to the General Assembly any changes appropriate in the
- 39 management structure and levels of funding of the Baltimore City Public Schools
- 40 School System.
- 41 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That it is the intent of the
- 42 General Assembly that the Chief Executive Officer, Chief Academic Officer, Chief
- 43 Operating Officer, and the Special Education Officer for the Baltimore City Public
- 44 School System, with the State Superintendent of Schools and the Assistant State
- 45 Superintendent for Special Education, shall meet at a minimum on a quarterly basis
- 46 with the Special Master assigned to the case, Vaughn G., et al v. Mayor and City

- 1 Council, et al, case no. MJG-84-1911, United States District Court for the District of
- 2 Maryland. After conducting six quarterly meetings, the State Superintendent and the
- 3 Chief Executive Officer shall have the discretion, acting jointly, to modify the
- 4 communication schedule upon providing the basis for any modification to the General
- 5 Assembly.
- 6 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Department of
- 7 Education, the Interagency Committee on Public School Construction, and the
- 8 Baltimore City Public School System shall develop a mechanism for communication
- 9 at a minimum on a quarterly basis among key executive level representatives of each
- 10 entity to address issues relating to facilities planning in the Baltimore City Public
- 11 School System, including the capital improvement program issues. After a minimum
- 12 of six quarterly meetings, the State Superintendent shall have the discretion to
- 13 modify the communication arrangement upon providing the basis for any
- 14 modification to the General Assembly.
- 15 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before June 30,
- 16 2003, Baltimore City shall bear the costs and complete the transfer of clear and
- 17 merchantable title of any real property assets associated with the operations of the
- 18 Baltimore City Public School System to the legal possession of the Board of School
- 19 Commissioners. By June 30, 2002, the Baltimore City Public School System shall
- 20 submit to the State Department of Education for its approval a written plan to
- 21 accomplish the required property transfer by June 30, 2003.
- 22 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That on or before June 30,
- 23 2003, Baltimore City shall transfer real property assets associated with the
- 24 operations of the Baltimore City Public School System, part or all of which were
- 25 funded by at least \$1 million in debt issued by Baltimore City after July 1, 1997, to
- 26 the legal possession of the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners. The
- 27 remaining real property assets associated with the operations of the Baltimore City
- 28 Public School System shall be transferred by Baltimore City to the legal possession of
- 29 the Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners in approximately equal annual
- 30 portions by June 30, 2009. Baltimore City shall bear the costs of the transfers by clear
- 31 and merchantable title. By June 30, 2002, Baltimore City and the Baltimore City
- 32 <u>Public School System shall prepare a written plan to accomplish the property</u>
- 33 transfers. The plan may provide for the transfer of additional real property assets by
- 34 June 30, 2003 if there is no Baltimore City debt outstanding for improvements or
- 35 modifications to the real property assets. The written plan shall be submitted to the
- 36 State Department of Education for its approval. Subject to § 2-1246 of the State
- 37 Government Article, a copy of the written plan shall be submitted to the Senate
- 38 <u>Budget and Taxation Committee</u>, the Senate Education, Health, and Environmental
- 39 Affairs Committee, the House Appropriations Committee, and the House Ways and
- 40 Means Committee.
- 41 SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding §§
- 42 4-114 and 4-115 of the Education Article as amended by Chapter 105 of the Acts of
- 43 1997, the Board of Public Works, for the period from July 1, 1997 through June 30,
- 44 2009, may approve State funding for capital improvements to public school buildings
- 45 in Baltimore City on property held under a clear deed and title by either the

- 1 Baltimore City Board of School Commissioners or the Mayor and City Council of
- 2 Baltimore. However, State funds for the construction of new schools in Baltimore City
- 3 may only be approved on sites with clear deed and title held by the Baltimore City
- 4 Board of School Commissioners.
- 5 SECTION 9. 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Baltimore City shall
- 6 continue to work with the Baltimore City Public School System to eliminate
- 7 environmental hazards within the school system and develop a memorandum of
- 8 understanding to provide funding for the elimination of these environmental hazards
- 9 after the transfer of title of real property assets to the Baltimore City Public School
- 10 System.
- 11 SECTION 10. 11. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That it is the intent of the
- 12 General Assembly that this Act constitutes further action by the General Assembly
- 13 regarding consideration of the provisions of § 3-108.1 of the Education Article for the
- 14 purpose of meeting the requirements of Section 28 of Chapter 105 of the Acts of the
- 15 General Assembly of 1997.
- 16 SECTION 11. 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That funds appropriated
- 17 for schools under local reconstitution in Baltimore City the Baltimore City-State
- 18 Partnership may be used to support the principal development initiative enacted by
- 19 this Act.
- 20 SECTION 12. 13. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 21 effect June 1, 2002.
