A BILL ENTITLED

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2 Interdepartmental Task Force on the Bulk Purchasing of Pharmaceuticals

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing an Interdepartmental Task Force on the Bulk
- 4 Purchasing of Pharmaceuticals; providing for the composition of the Task Force;
- 5 requiring the Governor to appoint the chairman of the Task Force; prohibiting
- 6 members from receiving compensation; allowing members to receive
- 7 reimbursement for expenses; providing for the staffing of the Task Force;
- 8 requiring the Task Force to investigate certain purchasing options, make
- 9 recommendations on certain topics, and conduct a certain study; requiring the
- 10 Task Force to submit a certain report to the Governor and certain committees on
- or before a certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally
- 12 relating to the Interdepartmental Task Force on the Bulk Purchasing of
- 13 Pharmaceuticals.

- 19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 21 Article 41 Governor Executive and Administrative Departments
- 22 18-319.
- 23 (A) THERE IS AN INTERDEPARTMENTAL TASK FORCE ON THE BULK
- 24 PURCHASING OF PHARMACEUTICALS.
- 25 (B) THE TASK FORCE SHALL BE COMPOSED OF AN OFFICER OR EMPLOYEE
- 26 FROM EACH OF THE FOLLOWING AGENCIES, APPOINTED BY THE ADMINISTRATIVE
- 27 HEAD OF THAT AGENCY:
- 28 (1) THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE;

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- 1 (2) THE DEPARTMENT OF BUDGET AND MANAGEMENT;
- 2 (3) THE DIVISION OF CORRECTIONS; AND
- 3 (4) ANY OTHER AGENCY THAT PURCHASES PHARMACEUTICALS, 4 DESIGNATED BY THE SECRETARY.
- 5 (C) THE GOVERNOR SHALL DESIGNATE THE CHAIRMAN OF THE TASK FORCE.
- 6 (D) A MEMBER OF THE TASK FORCE MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION BUT 7 IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE 8 TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.
- 9 (E) THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE SHALL 10 COORDINATE WITH OTHER MEMBER STATE AGENCIES TO PROVIDE STAFFING FOR 11 THE TASK FORCE.
- 12 (F) THE TASK FORCE SHALL:
- 13 (1) INVESTIGATE ANY AND ALL OPTIONS FOR BETTER PURCHASING 14 POWER OF PHARMACEUTICALS, INCLUDING:
- 15 (I) EXPANDING MEDICAID PURCHASING;
- 16 (II) QUALIFYING FOR PARTICIPATION IN PURCHASING PROGRAMS 17 UNDER 42 U.S.C. SECTION 256B, AS AMENDED; AND
- 18 (III) USING REBATE PROGRAMS, HOSPITAL DISPROPORTIONATE
- 19 SHARE PURCHASING, FEDERALLY QUALIFIED HEALTH CENTER PURCHASING, AND
- 20 PURCHASING BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE;
- 21 (2) MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS REGARDING DRUG UTILIZATION REVIEW,
- 22 PRIOR AUTHORIZATION, THE USE OF RESTRICTIVE FORMULARIES, THE USE OF MAIL
- 23 ORDER PROGRAMS, AND COPAYMENT STRUCTURES TO MEMBER AGENCIES; AND
- 24 (3) CONDUCT A STUDY AS TO WHETHER A BULK PURCHASING PROGRAM
- 25 THAT GRADUALLY INCORPORATES VARIOUS STATE AGENCIES INTO THE PROGRAM
- 26 OVER TIME WOULD BE FEASIBLE IN MARYLAND.
- 27 (G) THE TASK FORCE SHALL SUBMIT ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS
- 28 TO THE GOVERNOR, AND SUBJECT TO § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE,
- 29 TO THE SENATE EDUCATION, HEALTH, AND ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE
- 30 AND THE HOUSE ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS COMMITTEE ON OR BEFORE
- 31 DECEMBER 1, 2004.
- 32 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 33 October 1, 2002. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of
- 34 September 30, 2004, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this
- 35 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
