
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

#### 1 **Article - Business Occupations and Professions** 2 18-303. 3 (g) The Secretary may waive the requirements of subsections (a)(2) and (3), 4 (d), and (e) of this section and issue a license to an applicant who: 5 (1) provides adequate evidence that the applicant: 6 is licensed to engage in the business of providing security (i) systems services in another state; and 7 8 (ii) became licensed in the other state: 9 1. after meeting qualifications that are at least equivalent to 10 those required in this State; and 11 2. after submitting to a State and national criminal records 12 check; and 13 (2) pays to the Secretary a processing fee of \$150. 14 18-305. - 5 (a) A person who violates any provision of this title is guilty of a misdemeanor 6 and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding [\$1,000] \$500 or imprisonment not 7 exceeding 1 year or both.
- 8 (b) The fines assessed under §§ 18-309 and 18-3A-09 of this title may not 9 exceed \$5,000 per violation and shall be paid to the Secretary within 10 days after 10 final adjudication of any hearing or the waiver of any hearing.
