A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Task Force to Study Security Guard Training**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force to Study Security Guard Training;
4 providing for the membership, chairman, duties, and staffing of the Task Force;
5 requiring the Task Force to issue a certain report with recommendations by a
6 certain date; providing for the termination of this Act; and generally relating to
7 the establishment of a Task Force to Study Security Guard Training.

8 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
9 MARYLAND, That:

10 (a) there is a Task Force to Study Security Guard Training;

11 (b) the Task Force shall study how security guards at all levels of security are
12 trained and consult the Department of State Police in developing a written study;

13 (c) the Task Force shall consist of the following 9 members:

14 (1) a representative from the Governor's Emergency Management
15 Advisory Committee, appointed by the Governor;

16 (2) a representative from the Department of State Police, appointed by
17 the Governor;

18 (3) a representative from the Maryland Retailer's Association;

19 (4) a representative from the Maryland Association of Boards of
20 Education;

21 (5) three representatives from licensed security guard agencies, one each
22 from a small, medium, and large agency;

23 (6) one State Senator; and

24 (7) one State Delegate;

25 (d) the members of the Task Force shall select a chairman;

- 1 (e) the members of the Task Force shall serve without compensation;
- 2 (f) the Task Force shall be staffed by the Department of Legislative Services;
3 and
- 4 (g) the Task Force, subject to § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, shall
5 issue a final report of its findings and recommendations to the Senate Judicial
6 Proceedings Committee and the House Commerce and Government Matters
7 Committee on or before December 1, 2002.

8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
9 October 1, 2002. It shall remain in effect until December 1, 2002, and at the end of
10 December 1, 2002, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act
11 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
