Maryland	Genetic	Counselors	Act

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing the State Board of Genetic Counselors; providing for
- 4 the membership, terms, and chairman of the Board; providing for the duties of
- 5 the Board; requiring the Board to adopt certain regulations; requiring
- 6 individuals to be licensed genetic counselors before they may conduct genetic
- 7 testing in the State; providing for the licensing of genetic counselors; prohibiting
- 8 a licensed genetic counselor from failing to meet certain requirements; defining
- 9 certain terms; stating certain findings of the General Assembly; and generally
- relating to genetic counselors in the State.

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 21 SUBTITLE 1. DEFINITIONS; FINDINGS.

- 23 (A) IN THIS TITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS INDICATED.
- 24 (B) "BOARD" MEANS THE STATE BOARD OF GENETIC COUNSELORS.

- 1 (C) "CARRIER" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS A GENETIC ANOMALY AND IS
- 2 AT RISK OF HAVING CHILDREN WITH A GENETICALLY INFLUENCED DISEASE, BUT
- 3 THE INDIVIDUAL HAS NO PREDISPOSITION OF INCURRING THE DISEASE.
- 4 (D) "CERTIFIED GENETIC COUNSELOR" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL WHO HAS
- 5 VALID CERTIFICATION FROM THE AMERICAN BOARD OF GENETIC COUNSELING OR
- 6 THE AMERICAN BOARD OF MEDICAL GENETICS.
- 7 (E) "CLINICAL GENETICIST" MEANS A PHYSICIAN WITH A SPECIALTY IN
- 8 GENETICS AND WHO HAS BEEN CERTIFIED BY THE AMERICAN BOARD OF MEDICAL
- 9 GENETICS.
- 10 (F) "GENETIC ANOMALY" MEANS A VARIATION IN AN INDIVIDUAL'S DNA THAT
- 11 HAS BEEN SHOWN TO CONFER OR PREDISPOSE THE INDIVIDUAL TO A GENETICALLY
- 12 INFLUENCED DISEASE OR MAKES THE INDIVIDUAL A CARRIER OF THE VARIATION.
- 13 (G) (1) "GENETIC COUNSELING" MEANS AN EXPLANATION OR COUNSELING
- 14 REGARDING AN INDIVIDUAL'S GENETIC CONDITION INFERRED FROM THE
- 15 INDIVIDUAL'S FAMILY HISTORY OR GENETIC TESTS AND ITS IMPLICATION FOR THE
- 16 FUTURE HEALTH OF THE INDIVIDUAL AND THE INDIVIDUAL'S FAMILY.
- 17 (2) "GENETIC COUNSELING" INCLUDES INFORMATION AND
- 18 COUNSELING DESIGNED TO ELICIT AND SUPPORT AN INDIVIDUAL'S CHOICE TO GIVE
- 19 OR WITHHOLD INFORMED CONSENT TO A GENETIC TEST, OR DESIGNED TO CONVEY,
- 20 EXPLAIN, AND COUNSEL AN INDIVIDUAL IN REGARD TO THE RESULT OF A GENETIC
- 21 TEST.
- 22 (H) "GENETIC PREDISPOSITION" MEANS THE PRESENCE OF A VARIATION IN
- 23 THE COMPOSITION OF THE GENES OF AN INDIVIDUAL THAT IS SCIENTIFICALLY OR
- 24 MEDICALLY IDENTIFIABLE, AND THAT IS DETERMINED TO BE ASSOCIATED WITH AN
- 25 INCREASED STATISTICAL RISK OF BEING EXPRESSED AS A PHYSICAL OR MENTAL
- 26 DISEASE OR DISABILITY IN THE INDIVIDUAL, BUT THAT HAS NOT RESULTED IN A
- 27 DISEASE OR DISORDER.
- 28 (I) "GENETIC TEST" MEANS AN ASSAY EMPLOYING DNA, CONSTITUENT
- 29 GENES, OR GENE PRODUCTS TO DIAGNOSE OR PREDICT THE PRESENCE OF A
- 30 GENETIC ANOMALY THAT IS LINKED TO A PHYSICAL OR MENTAL DISEASE OR
- 31 DISABILITY IN THE INDIVIDUAL OR THE INDIVIDUAL'S CHILDREN, OR
- 32 SUSCEPTIBILITY TO OR PREDISPOSITION FOR A GENETICALLY INFLUENCED DISEASE
- 33 OR DISABILITY.
- 34 (J) "LICENSED GENETIC COUNSELOR" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL REGISTERED
- 35 UNDER § 6A-106 OF THIS TITLE.
- 36 (K) "MEDICAL GENETICIST" MEANS AN INDIVIDUAL HOLDING A DOCTORAL
- 37 DEGREE AND CERTIFIED AS A MEDICAL GENETICIST BY THE AMERICAN BOARD OF
- 38 MEDICAL GENETICS.

- 2 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS THAT:
- 3 (1) ADVANCES IN THE SCIENCE OF HUMAN GENETICS ARE RAPIDLY
- 4 EXPANDING THE ABILITY TO DIRECTLY TEST DNA TO DETERMINE GENETIC
- 5 PREDISPOSITIONS TO AN INCREASING NUMBER OF GENETICALLY INFLUENCED
- 6 HEALTH CONDITIONS;
- 7 (2) THE INTERPRETATION OF GENETIC TESTS IS COMPLEX AND
- 8 REQUIRES SPECIALIZED KNOWLEDGE AND COMMUNICATION SKILLS TO ENABLE
- 9 INDIVIDUALS TO MAKE INFORMED DECISIONS TO UNDERGO A GENETIC TEST AND TO
- 10 CONVEY THE RESULTS OF THE TESTS TO THE PATIENT;
- 11 (3) THE NATIONAL SOCIETY OF GENETIC COUNSELORS, INC., A
- 12 VOLUNTARY PROFESSIONAL ASSOCIATION OF GENETIC COUNSELORS, SETS HIGH
- 13 STANDARDS OF PROFESSIONAL ETHICS BUT DOES NOT HAVE ENFORCEMENT POWER
- 14 TO ASSURE THE CLIENT OF THE COMPETENCE OR THE ETHICAL CONDUCT OF A

- 16 (4) GENETIC COUNSELING SHALL BE A LICENSED PROFESSION, IN
- 17 ORDER TO SECURE THE BENEFITS OF GENETIC TESTING FOR THE PEOPLE OF THE
- 18 STATE OF MARYLAND WHILE PROTECTING THEM FROM UNNECESSARY FEAR AND

- 24 (A) THE BOARD SHALL CONSIST OF NINE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE
- 25 GOVERNOR.
- 26 (B) OF THE NINE MEMBERS:
- 27 (1) FOUR SHALL BE CERTIFIED OR LICENSED GENETIC COUNSELORS
- 28 WITH AT LEAST 5 YEARS OF PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE IN THE STATE;
- 29 (2) THREE SHALL BE CLINICAL GENETICISTS, MEDICAL GENETICISTS,
- 30 OR MOLECULAR BIOLOGISTS WITH A GENETIC SPECIALIZATION;

- 1 (C) THE MEMBERS SHALL SERVE 3-YEAR TERMS.
- 2 (D) THE CHAIRMAN SHALL BE SELECTED BY A MAJORITY VOTE OF THE
- 3 MEMBERS OF THE BOARD.
- 4 (E) A MAJORITY OF THE MEMBERS ON THE BOARD IS A QUORUM.
- 5 (F) A MEMBER OF THE BOARD MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION FOR
- 6 SERVING ON THE BOARD, BUT IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES
- 7 UNDER THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE
- 8 BUDGET.

- 10 (A) THE BOARD SHALL MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE SECRETARY ON:
- 11 (1) APPROPRIATE PROFESSIONAL GUIDELINES FOR GENETIC
- 12 COUNSELORS, INCLUDING THE CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION
- 13 NECESSARY TO ENSURE THE CURRENCY OF THE GENETIC COUNSELOR'S

- 19 AS A NECESSARY COMPONENT OF INFORMED CONSENT TO UNDERGO THE TESTS;

- 21 (3) THE CRITERIA BY WHICH PHYSICIANS SHOULD RECOGNIZE THE
- 22 NEED TO REFER PATIENTS TO LICENSED GENETIC COUNSELORS.
- 23 (B) THE BOARD SHALL:
- 24 (1) CONSULT WITH THE JOINT NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF HEALTH AND
- 25 FEDERAL DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY WORKING GROUP ON ETHICAL, LEGAL, AND
- 26 SOCIAL IMPLICATIONS OF THE HUMAN GENOME PROJECT;
- 27 (2) ASSESS THE RELIABILITY OF EACH NEW GENETIC TEST ANNUALLY;
- 28 AND
- 29 (3) RECOMMEND RULES ENSURING THAT THE USE OF THE GENETIC
- 30 TEST AS A SCREENING TEST FOR GROUPS OF INDIVIDUALS WILL NOT POSE UNDUE
- 31 RISKS TO INDIVIDUAL LIBERTIES AND CIVIL RIGHTS.
- 32 (C) THE BOARD SHALL STUDY AND MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE
- 33 GOVERNOR AND THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY WITH RESPECT TO:
- 34 (1) ENSURING THAT ANY USE OF A NEW GENETIC TEST BY INSURERS,
- 35 EMPLOYERS, OR EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS SHALL NOT COMPROMISE THE

HAS BEEN FOUND ELIGIBLE BY THE AMERICAN BOARD OF

1 AND CLINICAL EXPERIENCE, TO TAKE THE EXAMINATIONS FOR CERTIFICATION AS A 2 GENETIC COUNSELOR; AND (IV) HAS MET ANY OTHER REQUIREMENTS THE BOARD ADOPTS BY 4 REGULATION. A PRACTICING GENETIC COUNSELOR SHALL QUALIFY FOR A 6 PROVISIONAL LICENSE UPON PAYMENT OF A REGISTRATION FEE AS DETERMINED 7 BY THE BOARD AND UPON SUBMISSION OF SATISFACTORY EVIDENCE THAT THE 8 GENETIC COUNSELOR: 9 IS AT LEAST 21 YEARS OLD; (I) 10 (II)IS OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER; 11 (III)HAS BEEN CONTINUOUSLY ENGAGED IN GENETIC 12 COUNSELING WITHIN AN ESTABLISHED HUMAN GENETICS PROGRAM AFFILIATED 13 WITH A HOSPITAL, CLINIC, LABORATORY, OR OTHER HEALTH CARE PROVIDER, AT 14 LEAST HALF-TIME FOR 1 YEAR OR MORE AT THE TIME OF APPLICATION FOR THE 15 PROVISIONAL LICENSE; AND MEETS ANY OTHER REQUIREMENTS THE BOARD ADOPTS BY 16 (IV) 17 REGULATION. 18 (3) WHILE IT IS EFFECTIVE, A PROVISIONAL LICENSE UNDER THIS 19 SECTION AUTHORIZES THE HOLDER TO CONDUCT GENETIC COUNSELING SUBJECT 20 TO THE SAME RESTRICTIONS IMPOSED ON A HOLDER OF A GENERAL LICENSE TO 21 CONDUCT GENETIC COUNSELING. 22 A PROVISIONAL LICENSE EXPIRES AFTER 2 YEARS AND MAY NOT BE 23 RENEWED MORE THAN THREE TIMES. 24 SUBTITLE 4. PROHIBITED ACTS; DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES. 25 6A-401. - 1 (B) THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS ESTABLISHING DISCIPLINARY
- 2 PROCEEDINGS OF LICENSED GENETIC COUNSELORS.
- 3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 4 October 1, 2002.
