CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Advisory Council on Quality Care at the End of Life**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the State Advisory Council on Quality Care at the
4 End of Life; providing for the membership of the Advisory Council; providing for
5 the terms of members; requiring the Governor to appoint a successor if a
6 vacancy occurs; requiring the Governor to appoint the chair; providing for a
7 quorum; requiring the Advisory Council to meet a certain number of times each
8 year; prohibiting members from receiving compensation but allowing members
9 to receive reimbursement for certain expenses; requiring the Department of
10 Health and Mental Hygiene to provide certain support to the Advisory Council;
11 requiring the Advisory Council to monitor certain trends, study certain
12 information, provide recommendations to certain agencies regarding certain
13 agency activities, advise the General Assembly on certain legislation, and
14 participate in certain activities; and generally relating to the State Advisory
15 Council on Quality Care at the End of Life.

22 **Preamble**

23 **WHEREAS**, Every Marylander is entitled to and should expect competent,
24 compassionate, and respectful care when facing a life-limiting illness; and

1 WHEREAS, Many health care providers in Maryland are striving to improve the
 2 delivery of care to dying patients, including meticulous attention to pain and the
 3 management of other symptoms; and

4 WHEREAS, Public policy can have a significant effect on the environment in
 5 which end-of-life care is delivered; and

6 WHEREAS, A broadly diverse panel can play a key role in monitoring
 7 developments affecting end-of-life care in Maryland and providing advice to
 8 policymakers; now, therefore,

9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 10 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

11 **Article - Health - General**

12 SUBTITLE 16. STATE ADVISORY COUNCIL ON QUALITY CARE AT THE END OF LIFE.

16 (A) THE ADVISORY COUNCIL CONSISTS OF THE FOLLOWING ~~49~~ 20 MEMBERS:

17 (1) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL OR THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S DESIGNEE;

18 (2) ONE MEMBER OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND, APPOINTED BY THE
 19 PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE OF MARYLAND;

20 (3) ONE MEMBER OF THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, APPOINTED BY THE
 21 SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE;

22 (4) THE SECRETARY OF AGING OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE;

23 (5) THE SECRETARY OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE OR THE
 24 SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE; AND

25 (6) ~~14~~ 15 MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR:

26 (I) ONE PHYSICIAN WITH EXPERIENCE IN END-OF-LIFE CARE;

27 (II) ONE NURSE WITH EXPERIENCE IN END-OF-LIFE CARE;

28 (III) ONE PHARMACIST WITH EXPERIENCE IN END-OF-LIFE CARE;

29 ~~(III)~~ (IV) ONE PHYSICIAN WITH EXPERIENCE MANAGING
 30 LONG-TERM CARE;

1 ~~(IV)~~ (V) ONE NURSE WITH EXPERIENCE MANAGING LONG-TERM
2 CARE;

3 ~~(V)~~ (VI) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE HEALTH INSURANCE
4 INDUSTRY;

5 ~~(VI)~~ (VII) ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM A MANAGED CARE
6 ORGANIZATION;

7 ~~(VII)~~ (VIII) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE LEGAL COMMUNITY;

8 ~~(VIII)~~ (IX) ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE HOSPICE CARE
9 COMMUNITY;

10 ~~(IX)~~ (X) TWO REPRESENTATIVES FROM ADVOCACY GROUPS FOR
11 END-OF-LIFE CARE;

12 ~~(X)~~ (XI) TWO REPRESENTATIVES FROM RELIGIOUS GROUPS; AND

13 ~~(XI)~~ (XII) TWO REPRESENTATIVES OF THE GENERAL PUBLIC WITH
14 EXPERIENCE WITH END-OF-LIFE OR LONG-TERM CARE ISSUES.

15 (B) (1) THE TERM OF A MEMBER APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR IS 4 YEARS.

16 (2) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO SERVE UNTIL A
17 SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND QUALIFIES.

18 (3) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS BEGUN SERVES
19 ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED AND
20 QUALIFIES.

21 (4) A MEMBER WHO SERVES TWO CONSECUTIVE 4-YEAR TERMS MAY
22 NOT BE REAPPOINTED FOR FOUR YEARS AFTER THE COMPLETION OF THOSE TERMS.

23 (5) IF A VACANCY OCCURS AMONG THE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE
24 GOVERNOR, THE GOVERNOR SHALL PROMPTLY APPOINT A SUCCESSOR.

25 13-1603.

26 (A) THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT THE CHAIR OF THE ADVISORY COUNCIL.

27 (B) THE MEMBERS PRESENT AT A MEETING ARE A QUORUM TO DO BUSINESS.

28 (C) THE ADVISORY COUNCIL SHALL MEET AT LEAST TWICE A YEAR, AT THE
29 TIMES AND PLACES THAT IT DETERMINES.

30 (D) A MEMBER OF THE ADVISORY COUNCIL MAY NOT RECEIVE
31 COMPENSATION BUT IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE
32 STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

1 (E) THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE SHALL PROVIDE
2 STAFF SUPPORT AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE FOR THE ADVISORY COUNCIL.

3 13-1604.

4 THE ADVISORY COUNCIL SHALL:

5 (1) MONITOR TRENDS IN THE PROVISION OF CARE TO MARYLANDERS
6 WITH LIFE-LIMITING ILLNESSES;

7 (2) STUDY THE IMPACT OF STATE STATUTES, REGULATIONS, POLICIES,
8 AND OTHER ASPECTS OF PUBLIC POLICY ON THE PROVISION OF CARE AT THE END OF
9 LIFE;

10 (3) PROVIDE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE OFFICE OF THE ATTORNEY
11 GENERAL, THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE, THE DEPARTMENT
12 OF AGING, AND OTHER AGENCIES OF STATE GOVERNMENT WITH RESPECT TO THEIR
13 ACTIVITIES AFFECTING THE PROVISION OF CARE AT THE END OF LIFE;

14 (4) ADVISE THE MARYLAND GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON LEGISLATIVE
15 PROPOSALS AFFECTING THE PROVISION OF CARE AT THE END OF LIFE;

16 (5) PARTICIPATE IN OR OTHERWISE PROMOTE PUBLIC AND
17 PROFESSIONAL EDUCATIONAL EFFORTS CONCERNING CARE AT THE END OF LIFE;
18 AND

19 (6) CARRY OUT OTHER DUTIES AS MAY BE REQUESTED BY THE
20 GOVERNOR OR THE MARYLAND GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the terms of the initial
22 members of the Advisory Council appointed by the Governor shall expire as follows:

23 (1) Three members in 2003;

24 (2) Three members in 2004;

25 (3) Four members in 2005; and

26 (4) Four members in 2006.

27 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
28 October 1, 2002.
