- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 18 (a) This section provides a fund to pay the expense of protecting and managing
- 19 game and freshwater fish and preventing unauthorized persons from fishing or
- 20 attempting to fish for any game and freshwater fish without first procuring an
- 21 angler's license.
- 22 (b) (1) In this section, "resident" means a person who resides in this State on
- 23 the date he applies for a license.
- 24 (2) "Resident" includes a member of the armed forces of the United
- 25 States who is on active duty and stationed officially in this State.
- 26 (c) Any person 16 years old or older shall secure an angler's license to fish in
- 27 the nontidal waters of the State. An angler's license entitles the holder to fish in the
- 28 nontidal waters of the State only during the open season.

1 (d) An angler's license is not required of the following: 2 The owner or tenant of land bordering on nontidal water, his spouse (1) 3 and children, or the spouse of any child who resides on the land with the owner or 4 tenant when he fishes in nontidal water adjoining his land; 5 Any convalescent patient of a veterans' hospital hospitalized for a 6 service connected disability who fishes in nontidal waters if the patient secures a permit issued by a special service officer of the American Red Cross under authority 8 granted by the Department; 9 Any group of disabled or convalescent patients organized and under (3) 10 the care and supervision of the American Red Cross, which upon the request of the 11 American Red Cross, is authorized by the Department to fish for any recreational 12 purpose in the nontidal waters; 13 Any resident serving in the armed forces of the United States, while 14 on leave in the State, during his leave period, if, while angling, he possesses a copy of 15 his official leave orders: 16 Any patient who is under treatment by a State-approved mental 17 health facility, and any individual who attends or resides in a State-approved 18 retardation facility; 19 A caregiver, family member, or designee of a mental health care (6)20 facility or private group home of a patient who is under treatment by a 21 State-approved mental health facility, provided that: 22 The administrator of the mental health care facility, or treating 23 physician or psychologist provides the Department with a letter stating that the 24 caregiver or family member is the primary caretaker of the patient; or 25 The individual accompanying the patient carries a copy of the 26 letter described under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph, or a professional license or certificate of a health care professional involved in the care of the patient; A person who fishes in nontidal waters of the State on free fishing 28 (7) 29 days designated by the Secretary; or 30 A person holding a current resident consolidated senior sport fishing 31 license issued under § 4-216 of this title. 32 A person may apply for an angler's license to any person designated by the (e) 33 Department. - 1 (ii) The Department shall publicly report annually the amounts 2 collected and the expenditures under this section.
- 3 (h) A person designated to sell an angler's license shall issue the license and
- 4 collect the fee prescribed in subsection (g) of this section. The Department shall
- 5 furnish the licenses to the designated persons. An angler's license shall bear the
- 6 Secretary's facsimile signature and the counter-signature of the issuing person. The
- 7 person who issues the license shall [fill out] ENTER the name and address of the
- 8 licensee [on a stub attached to the license blank and detach the stub]. The [stubs
- 9 and COLLECTED money[, collected every month,] shall be [mailed] TRANSMITTED
- 10 to the Department [on the first day of the succeeding month] AS PRESCRIBED BY THE
- 11 DEPARTMENT. As compensation, the agent shall retain [50 cents] \$1 for each license
- 12 issued.
- 13 (i) Every angler's license shall expire on December 31 of each year following 14 the date of issuance.
- 15 (j) The licensee shall sign his name in ink on the license at the time of
- 16 purchase. The license may not be transferred to another person, nor used or
- 17 presented by any person other than the person to whom it was issued.
