4	WHEREAS, Public agencies spend millions of dollars on public works projects every year, and it is essential that the contractors, subcontractors, workers, and public agencies involved in public works projects be covered by comprehensive workers' compensation and general liability insurance; and				
8 9	WHEREAS, Contractors and subcontractors pass on the high cost of workers' compensation and general liability insurance by including the costs in the bids they submit for public works projects and the high cost of obtaining workers' compensation and general liability insurance can prohibit small business and minority/disadvantaged owned businesses from bidding on public works projects; and				
13 14 15 16	WHEREAS, When public agencies purchase workers' compensation and general liability insurance for public works projects, they are able to establish strict safety programs that make the projects safer for workers and realize significant savings by using their purchasing power to obtain workers' compensation and general liability insurance for public works projects, thereby relieving the individual contractors and subcontractors from having to purchase the policies and enabling the contractors and subcontractors to submit lower bids; and

- 1 THE CONTRACTORS AND SUBCONTRACTORS ON A SPECIFIC PUBLIC WORKS PROJECT
- 2 COMBINED WITH A CENTRALLY ADMINISTERED SAFETY PROGRAM.
- 3 (2) "OWNER CONTROLLED INSURANCE PROGRAM" INCLUDES POLICIES
- 4 COVERING WORKERS' COMPENSATION, GENERAL LIABILITY, ENVIRONMENTAL
- $5\ LIABILITY, PROFESSIONAL\ LIABILITY,\ CASUALTY,\ PROPERTY,\ TITLE,\ BUSINESS$
- 6 INTERPRETATION, BUSINESS RISK, FORCE MAJEURE, COMPLETION, AND OTHER

- 8 (C) "PUBLIC AGENCY" MEANS A DEPARTMENT, AGENCY, AUTHORITY, BOARD.
- 9 COMMISSION, OR SIMILAR ENTITY OF THE STATE, A COUNTY, OR MUNICIPAL
- 10 CORPORATION ORGANIZED UNDER STATE LAW FOR A PUBLIC PURPOSE.
- 11 (D) (1) "PUBLIC WORKS PROJECT" MEANS ANY CONSTRUCTION,
- 12 RENOVATION, DESIGN, ENGINEERING OR INSPECTION UNDERTAKING BEING
- 13 PERFORMED AT ONE SITE OR A SERIES OF SITES, AT ONE TIME OR OVER A SERIES OF
- 14 YEARS, FUNDED BY OR AT THE DIRECTION OF A PUBLIC AGENCY.
- 15 (2) "PUBLIC WORKS PROJECT" INCLUDES THE CONSTRUCTION AND
- 16 RECONSTRUCTION OF ROADS AND BRIDGES, THE BUILDING AND REHABILITATION
- 17 OF WATER AND SEWER WORKS, AND THE CONSTRUCTION AND RENOVATION OF

- 23 HARD CONSTRUCTION COSTS ARE IN EXCESS OF \$100,000,000, WITH THE GOALS OF

- 1 (C) AN OWNER CONTROLLED INSURANCE PROGRAM USED BY A PUBLIC 2 AGENCY UNDER THIS SECTION:
- 3 (1) SHALL MAINTAIN COMPLETED OPERATIONS COVERAGE FOR A TERM 4 OF AT LEAST 3 YEARS DURING WHICH COVERAGE IS REASONABLY COMMERCIALLY
- 5 AVAILABLE AS DETERMINED BY THE TREASURER;
- 6 (2) MAY NOT PROHIBIT A CONTRACTOR OR SUBCONTRACTOR FROM
- 7 PURCHASING ANY ADDITIONAL INSURANCE COVERAGE THAT THE CONTRACTOR OR
- 8 SUBCONTRACTOR BELIEVES IS NECESSARY FOR PROTECTION FROM ANY LIABILITY
- 9 ARISING OUT OF THE CONTRACT, BUT THE COST OF THE ADDITIONAL INSURANCE
- 10 MAY NOT BE PASSED THROUGH TO THE STATE ON A CONTRACT BID; AND
- 11 (3) MAY NOT INCLUDE SURETY INSURANCE.
- 12 (D) THE PUBLIC AGENCY MAY PURCHASE AN OWNER CONTROLLED
- 13 INSURANCE POLICY THAT HAS A DEDUCTIBLE OR SELF-INSURED RETENTION IF THE
- 14 DEDUCTIBLE OR SELF-INSURED RETENTION DOES NOT EXCEED \$1,000,000.

- 16 (A) EACH PUBLIC AGENCY THAT USES AN OWNER CONTROLLED INSURANCE
- 17 PROGRAM FOR A PUBLIC WORKS PROJECT SHALL SUBMIT TO THE TREASURER A

- 19 (1) OUTLINES THE EXPERIENCE WITH THE OWNER CONTROLLED
- 20 INSURANCE PROGRAM;
- 21 (2) DETAILS ANY SAVINGS REALIZED UNDER THE OWNER CONTROLLED
- 22 INSURANCE PROGRAM; AND
- 23 (3) MAKES SUGGESTIONS FOR OTHER PUBLIC AGENCIES CONSIDERING
- 24 AN OWNER CONTROLLED INSURANCE PROGRAM.
- 25 (B) THE TREASURER SHALL COLLECT AND ANALYZE THE REPORTS
- 26 SUBMITTED UNDER THIS SECTION AND MONITOR EACH PUBLIC WORKS PROJECT
- 27 THAT EXCEEDS \$100,000,000 WITH RESPECT TO THE USE OF OWNER CONTROLLED
- 28 INSURANCE PROGRAMS.
- 29 (C) THE TREASURER PERIODICALLY SHALL REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND,
- 30 IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, THE GENERAL
- 31 ASSEMBLY ON THE DATA COLLECTED UNDER THIS SECTION AND ANY
- 32 RECOMMENDATIONS AS TO CONTINUED USE OF OWNER CONTROLLED INSURANCE
