# A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

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### **Statewide Advisory Commission on Immunizations**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the Statewide Advisory Commission on

- 4 Immunizations; providing for the composition of the Commission; requiring the
- 5 Secretary of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to appoint the
- 6 members of the Commission; requiring a certain member to chair the
- 7 Commission, establish certain subcommittees, and appoint certain
- 8 subcommittee chairs; providing for the terms of the members; prohibiting a
- 9 member from receiving compensation but allowing members to be reimbursed
- 10 for expenses; requiring the Department to provide staffing for the Commission;
- 11 requiring the Commission to study and recommend whether the State should
- 12 adopt a certain vaccine program by a certain date; requiring the Commission to
- 13 continuously monitor the status of certain vaccines and develop a
- 14 recommendation on a certain plan; requiring the Commission to develop and
- 15 publish certain recommendations regarding skipped or postponed dosages of
- 16 vaccines and to develop a certain form to be used by certain schools; requiring
- 17 the Commission to develop and implement a certain process to delay certain
- 18 school requirements under certain circumstances; requiring the Commission to
- 19 develop a certain communications campaign; requiring the Commission to
- 20 create a plan for a certain infrastructure to be used under certain
- 21 circumstances; requiring the Commission to submit certain reports; altering the
- 22 process to be used for adopting certain regulations relating to immunizations
- and certain blood tests of children; and generally relating to the Statewide
- 24 Advisory Commission on Immunizations.

3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 4 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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## Article - Health - General

6 18-214.

7 (A) THERE IS A STATEWIDE ADVISORY COMMISSION ON IMMUNIZATIONS.

8 (B) THE COMMISSION CONSISTS OF AT LEAST THE FOLLOWING MEMBERS:

9 (1) ONE PHYSICIAN MEMBER OF THE MEDICAL AND CHIRURGICAL 10 FACULTY PUBLIC HEALTH COUNCIL;

11 (2) ONE PHYSICIAN MEMBER OF THE MARYLAND CHAPTER OF THE 12 AMERICAN ACADEMY OF PEDIATRICS WHO SPECIALIZES IN INFECTIOUS DISEASES;

13(3)ONE PHYSICIAN MEMBER OF THE MARYLAND CHAPTER OF THE14AMERICAN ACADEMY OF PEDIATRICS WITH EXPERIENCE IN PRIVATE PRACTICE;

15(4)ONE PHYSICIAN MEMBER OF THE MARYLAND ACADEMY OF FAMILY16 PHYSICIANS;

17 (5) ONE PHYSICIAN MEMBER OF THE AMERICAN COLLEGE OF18 PHYSICIANS - INTERNAL MEDICINE SOCIETY OF MARYLAND;

19 (6) FOUR PHYSICIANS WHO ADMINISTER VACCINES;

20 (7) ONE LOCAL HEALTH OFFICER;

(8) ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE DEPARTMENT'S CENTER FOR
 IMMUNIZATIONS;

23 (9) ONE REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE DEPARTMENT'S VACCINES FOR
 24 CHILDREN PROGRAM; AND

(10) ONE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE MARYLAND SCHOOL SYSTEM,
NOMINATED BY THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS.

27 (C) THE SECRETARY OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL
28 HYGIENE SHALL APPOINT THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE COMMISSION, BASED ON THE
29 RECOMMENDATION OF THE APPROPRIATE MEDICAL SOCIETY OR AGENCY.

30 (D) THE PHYSICIAN MEMBER OF THE MEDICAL AND CHIRURGICAL FACULTY 31 PUBLIC HEALTH COUNCIL SHALL:

32 (1) CHAIR THE COMMISSION;

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1 (2) ESTABLISH SUBCOMMITTEES TO FACILITATE THE WORK OF THE 2 COMMISSION; AND

3 (3) APPOINT SUBCOMMITTEE CHAIRS FROM AMONG THE COMMISSION 4 MEMBERS.

5 (E) (1) THE TERM OF A MEMBER IS 4 YEARS.

6 (2) A MEMBER MAY NOT SERVE MORE THAN TWO CONSECUTIVE TERMS.

7 (F) A MEMBER OF THE COMMISSION MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION BUT
8 IS ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT FOR EXPENSES UNDER THE STANDARD STATE
9 TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

10 (G) THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE SHALL PROVIDE 11 THE STAFFING FOR THE COMMISSION.

12 (H) THE COMMISSION SHALL:

(1) STUDY AND RECOMMEND ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 15, 2003
 WHETHER THE STATE SHOULD ADOPT A PROGRAM TO PURCHASE VACCINES FOR ALL
 CHILDREN, KNOWN AS UNIVERSAL PURCHASE, THROUGH POOLED FUNDING FROM
 THE FEDERAL VACCINES FOR CHILDREN PROGRAM, INSURERS, AND OTHER
 CURRENT FUNDERS OF VACCINE;

18 (2) CONTINUOUSLY MONITOR THE INVENTORY OF VACCINES IN THE 19 STATE INCLUDING:

20 (I) DETERMINING WHERE COMMUNITY VACCINE SHORTAGES 21 EXIST AND WHICH VACCINES ARE IN SHORT SUPPLY;

22 (II) DEVELOPING A RECOMMENDATION ON A PLAN FOR THE 23 EQUITABLE DISTRIBUTION OF VACCINES; AND

24 (III) REPORTING ANY FINDINGS TO THE DEPARTMENT IN A TIMELY 25 MANNER;

26 (3) DEVELOP AND PUBLISH UNIFORM AND CONSISTENT STATE
27 SPONSORED RECOMMENDATIONS FOR SKIPPED OR POSTPONED DOSAGES OF
28 VACCINES AND DEVELOP A FORM THAT SHALL BE USED BY SCHOOLS IN THE STATE;

29 (4) DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT A UNIFORM PROCESS FOR SUSPENDING
 30 SCHOOL ENTRY VACCINATION REQUIREMENTS WHEN VACCINE SHORTAGES DELAY
 31 IMMUNIZATION OF CHILDREN;

32 (5) DEVELOP A COMMUNICATIONS CAMPAIGN TO INFORM THE
 33 GENERAL PUBLIC IN THE EVENT OF A VACCINE SHORTAGE; AND

34 (6) CREATE A PLAN FOR AN INFRASTRUCTURE THAT CAN EQUITABLY
 35 DISTRIBUTE VACCINATIONS IN THE EVENT OF A BIOTERRORISM EMERGENCY.

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1 (I) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 15 OF EACH YEAR, THE COMMISSION SHALL 2 SUBMIT A REPORT ON THE STATUS OF VACCINE SHORTAGES AND IMMUNIZATION 3 RATES IN THE STATE, TO THE GOVERNOR AND, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF 4 THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE SENATE EDUCATION, HEALTH, AND 5 ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE AND THE ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS 6 COMMITTEE.

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### **Article - Education**

9 (a) (1) In cooperation with the State Board and the [Medical and

10 Chirurgical Faculty of Maryland] STATEWIDE ADVISORY COMMISSION ON

11 IMMUNIZATIONS, the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene shall adopt rules

12 and regulations regarding the immunizations and blood tests for lead poisoning

13 required of children entering schools.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, on or before December

15 15, 2003, the Commission shall report on the Commission's recommendations

16 regarding the universal purchase of vaccine described in § 18-214(h)(1) of the Health

17 - General Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, to the Governor and, in

18 accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the Senate Education,

19 Health, and Environmental Affairs Committee and the Environmental Matters

20 Committee.

21 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 22 October 1, 2002.

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
