CHAPTER 1 AN ACT concerning 2 Talbot County and Dorchester County, Dorchester, Caroline, Kent, and 3 Queen Anne's Counties - Chief Deputy Sheriffs and Deputy Sheriffs -4 **Employment Status** 5 FOR the purpose of establishing that a chief deputy sheriff or the managerial equivalent appointed by the Sheriff of Dorchester County, Caroline County, 6 7 Kent County, or Queen Anne's County shall serve at the pleasure of the 8 respective Sheriff; prohibiting the Sheriff of Dorchester County and the Sheriff 9 of Talbot County Sheriffs of Dorchester, Talbot, Caroline, Kent, and Queen Anne's counties from refusing to reappoint a deputy sheriff in the respective 10 county without just cause; authorizing the Sheriff Sheriffs of Talbot County and 11 Caroline counties to appoint a chief deputy sheriff or the managerial equivalent 12 who shall serve at the pleasure of the respective Sheriff; and generally relating 13 14 to the chief deputy sheriffs and deputy sheriffs in Talbot County and in 15 Dorchester County., Dorchester, Caroline, Kent, and Queen Anne's counties.
