HOUSE BILL 1285

1 THE SHERIFF MAY NOT REFUSE TO REAPPOINT A DEPUTY 2 SHERIFF WITHOUT JUST CAUSE. The Commissioners may appoint an assistant deputy sheriff, at (IV) 4 a salary set by the County Commissioners of at least \$4,200. The salaries are in lieu of all expenses, fees, costs, and charges, 6 except for the board and keeping of prisoners in the county jail and other necessary 7 operating expenses allowed by law or practice, including all expenses for transferring 8 persons to and from penal institutions, places of confinement and State institutions 9 in the State under sentence or order of an authority. The Sheriff of Talbot County shall receive a salary as set by the 10 11 County Council. [He] THE SHERIFF may appoint, subject to the approval of the 13 County Council, the number of deputies [he] THE SHERIFF deems necessary at the 14 compensation fixed by the County Council prior to the appointment. 15 THE SHERIFF MAY APPOINT A CHIEF DEPUTY SHERIFF, OR THE 16 MANAGERIAL EQUIVALENT, WHO SHALL SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE SHERIFF. 17 THE SHERIFF MAY NOT REFUSE TO REAPPOINT A DEPUTY SHERIFF 18 WITHOUT JUST CAUSE. 19 (5) The Sheriff's office shall be operated on a 24-hour daily basis.
