14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 (a) Under the direction of the county superintendent, a county board [may]

19 SHALL take a school census of the children under the age of [18] 21 in its county

20 DURING SCHOOL YEARS ENDING IN AN EVEN NUMBER, including a census of

21 [handicapped] children WITH DISABILITIES both of school age and of preschool age.

(b) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, THE SCHOOL
CENSUS DATA SHALL BE REPORTED TO THE STATE BOARD AND THE GENERAL
ASSEMBLY.

# (2) THE DATA COLLECTED ABOUT CHILDREN WITH DISABILITIES SHALL 26 BE REPORTED BY DISABLING CONDITION AND LEVEL OF SERVICE.

27 (C) [Any] ALL data collected as to [handicapped] children WITH

28 DISABILITIES shall be furnished to the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene.

1 [(c)] (D) Any person who has under his control a child under the age of 18 and 2 who withholds information needed for the census from any officer demanding it or

3 who makes any false statement about the child is guilty of a misdemeanor and on

4 conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$20.

5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 6 October 1, 2002.
