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## Chapter 183 of the Acts of 2001

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 21 July 1, 2001. It shall remain effective for a period of [1 year] 6 YEARS and, at the end 22 of June 30, [2002] 2007, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this 23 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 25 June 1, 2002.
