1 (v) Whenever practicable, be selected and arranged to avoid 2 architectural and other barriers that impede access or voting by elderly and 3 physically disabled voters.			
 4 (3) (i) The public official responsible for the use of any public building 5 requested by a local board for a polling place shall make available to the local board, 6 without charge, the space that is needed in the building for the proper conduct of an 7 election. 			
8 (ii) Light, heat, and custodial and janitorial services for the space 9 shall be provided to the local board without charge.			
10 (4) (i) If suitable space in a public building is not available, a local 11 board may pay a reasonable fee for the use of space in a privately owned building.			
12 (ii) Except as provided in subparagraph (iii) of this paragraph, an 13 election may not be held in any building or part of any building used or occupied by an 14 establishment that holds an alcoholic beverages license.

12 abrogated and of no further force and effect.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, subject to the provisionsof Section 3 of this Act, this Act shall take effect January 1, 2003.
