4 FOR the purpose of requiring that each District Court bailiff, whether full-time or

- 5 part-time, be a permanent employee in the personnel system of the Judicial
- 6 Branch; requiring the Administrative Office of the Courts to review the
- 7 compensation of District Court bailiffs and report certain findings and
- 8 recommendations to the General Assembly on or before a certain date; providing

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Administrative Office 24 of the Courts:

(a) shall review the compensation of District Court bailiffs and evaluate
 the appropriateness of their compensation in comparison to the compensation of other
 court personnel, including bailiffs in the circuit courts; and

1 (b) on or before December 15, 2002, shall report to the General Assembly, 2 in accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, on its findings and 3 recommendations.

4 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the provisions of § 2-609 5 of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article, as enacted by Section 1 of this Act, 6 shall apply to all bailiffs employed by the District Court on or after the effective date 7 of this Act.

8 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 2002.
