BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 5 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 6 Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages 7 6-201. 8 (a) A Class B beer, wine and liquor license shall be issued by the license (1) 9 issuing authority of the county in which the place of business is located, and the 10 license authorizes its holder to keep for sale and sell all alcoholic beverages at retail 11 at any hotel or restaurant at the place described, for consumption on the premises or 12 elsewhere, or as provided in this section. 13 (k) (1) This subsection applies only in Dorchester County. 14 Bona fide restaurants, motels and hotels having restaurant (2) 15 facilities for serving full-course meals at least twice daily and seating capacity at 16 tables for [100] 75 or more persons, not including seats at bars or counters, may obtain a license from the County Commissioners. This license entitles the licensee to sell beer, wines, and liquors. 19 (ii) The annual license fee is \$1,000. 20 (3) This license provides for the consumption of wine and liquor on the 21 premises only. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 22
