2 3	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
	(a) The Department of Legislative Services shall conduct a study of the laws of other states to determine the organizational structure of operational fire and rescue services in other states.

8 9	(1) the structure in other states for providing operational fire and rescue services, including whether those services are provided on a local or statewide level;

The Director shall maintain liaison with and cooperate with emergency management agencies and organizations of other states and of the federal government.
