- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 22 Article Education
- 23 7-704.
- 24 (a) In this section, "Program" means the Maryland Meals for Achievement
- 25 Pilot In-Classroom Breakfast Program.

1 There is a pilot school breakfast program in the State, known as the (b) (1) 2 Maryland Meals for Achievement Pilot In-Classroom Breakfast Program. The Program is a joint effort of the Department and the county 4 boards or sponsoring agencies for eligible nonpublic schools. 5 (d) The Department shall: Develop an application form for a school that desires to participate in 6 (1) 7 the Program: 8 Ensure that the schools that participate in the Program represent (2) geographic and socioeconomic balance statewide; 10 Ensure that a school that participates in the Program is a school at 11 which at least 40% of the registered students are eligible for the federal free or 12 reduced price meal program; 13 Select schools to participate in the Program, ensuring that an (4) 14 ANNUAL evaluation of the Program is conducted by [an institution of higher 15 education or other unit of State government that is independent of the Department; Annually review and set the meal reimbursement rate for schools 16 (5) 17 that participate in the Program to complement the federal meal reimbursement rate 18 determined under § 7-703 of this subtitle; and 19 (6)Disburse the Program funds to the county board or the sponsoring 20 agency. 21 Chapter 384 of the Acts of 1999 22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 23 July 1, 1999. It shall remain effective for a period of [3] 6 years and, at the end of 24 June 30, [2002] 2005, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this 25 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect. Chapter 385 of the Acts of 1999 26 27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 28 July 1, 1999. It shall remain effective for a period of [3] 6 years and, at the end of 29 June 30, [2002] 2005, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this 30 Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 31 32 July 1, 2002.
