- 23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 24 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article - State Personnel and Pensions** 2 29-203. 3 (a) This section applies only to an individual who dies while employed as a 4 member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System: 5 (1) without willful negligence by the member; and with more than 2 years of eligibility service; or 6 (2) (i) 7 with death arising out of or in the course of the actual (ii) performance of duty. 9 (b) When the Board of Trustees receives proof of death of a member and finds 10 that the death has occurred in the manner described in subsection (a) of this section, 11 the Board of Trustees shall pay: 12 if the member is survived by a spouse or child under the age of 18 (1) 13 years, an allowance of [50% of the ordinary disability retirement allowance provided 14 for in § 29-108 of this subtitle:] TWO-THIRDS OF THE MEMBER'S AVERAGE FINAL 15 COMPENSATION: to the surviving spouse; or 16 (i) 17 if there is no surviving spouse or if the surviving spouse dies (ii) 18 before the youngest child of the member is 18 years old, to any children of the deceased member who are under the age of 18 years; or 20 (2) if the member is not survived by a spouse or child under the age of 18 21 years, the death benefit under § 29-202 of this subtitle. 22 If the Board of Trustees pays an allowance under this section to more than 23 one child, the Board of Trustees shall divide the allowance among the children under 24 the age of 18 years in a manner that provides for payments to continue until each child dies or becomes 18 years old. 26 29-204. 27 This section applies only to an individual who dies while employed as a (a) 28 member of the State Police Retirement System: without willful negligence by the member; and 29 (1) 30 (2) (i) with more than 2 years of eligibility service; or with death arising out of or in the course of the actual 31 (ii) 32 performance of duty.
