HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

2 Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month

- 3 FOR the purpose of designating September of each year as "Ovarian Cancer
- 4 Awareness Month".
- 5 WHEREAS, Each year, while approximately 82,000 women in the United States
- 6 are diagnosed with cancers affecting the reproductive organs, ovarian cancer is the
- 7 most serious form of gynecologic cancers, killing approximately 40 women a day,
- 8 accounting for 4% of all cancers among women, and ranking fifth as a cause of their
- 9 deaths from cancer:
- WHEREAS, Public health experts estimate that over 23,000 women in the
- 11 United States will be diagnosed with ovarian cancer in 2001, with one woman out of
- 12 every 55 developing ovarian cancer at some point in her life;
- WHEREAS, Public health experts estimate that over 14,000 women in the
- 14 United States will die from ovarian cancer in 2001;
- 15 WHEREAS. Ovarian cancer is often referred to as the "silent killer" because the
- 16 symptoms are often subtle, vague, and easily confused with other ailments, making it
- 17 difficult to diagnose and thus allowing this lethal malignancy the opportunity to
- 18 spread through a woman's abdomen and beyond before being detected;
- 19 WHEREAS, Over 75% of women diagnosed with ovarian cancer are not
- 20 diagnosed until the cancer has spread beyond the ovaries, resulting in a 5-year
- 21 survival rate of only 15% to 20%;
- WHEREAS, Early detection of ovarian cancer approaches a 95% survival rate,
- 23 however, only 25% of all cases are diagnosed at this stage; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Because there is currently no effective, easy-to-use means of early
- 25 detection for ovarian cancer, knowledge, understanding, and an awareness of the
- 26 disease and its symptoms are every woman's best defense against ovarian cancer;
- 27 now, therefore, be it

- 1 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the month
- 2 of September in each year is designated as "Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month"; and
- 3 be it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That public health agencies are urged to develop strategies,
- 5 pamphlets, public service announcements, presentations, and a coordinated
- 6 campaign to increase public awareness and knowledge regarding this virulent
- 7 disease; and be it further
- 8 RESOLVED, That hospitals, health care providers, service organizations,
- 9 newspapers, advertisers, schools, and individuals are encouraged to participate fully
- 10 in this struggle to save lives through public education regarding ovarian cancer; and
- 11 be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 13 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;
- 14 the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and
- 15 the Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates.
