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HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 A House Joint Resolution concerning
- 2 Condemnation of the Terrorist Attacks of September 11, 2001
- 3 FOR the purpose of condemning the terrorist attacks that occurred on September 11,
- 4 2001.
- 5 WHEREAS, On September 11, 2001, the hearts of all Americans were pierced by
- 6 an act of foreign aggression that will forever be remembered as a second day of infamy
- 7 in the history of our beloved Nation; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The wanton, premeditated, and diabolical acts by terrorist fanatics,
- 9 resulting in the unspeakable carnage of thousands of innocent men, women, and
- 10 children of all races, religions, creeds, and nationalities, revealed to the world the
- 11 devastating horror of absolute evil; and
- WHEREAS, The physical destruction rendered by the despicable tyrants of
- 13 terror on two of America's most inimitable cherished communities New York City
- 14 and Washington, D.C., the Nation's capital will forever remain vivid in the
- 15 American memory as a painful price exacted for the openness and freedom of
- 16 American society and the trust America extends to all brothers and sisters who enter
- 17 its communities; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Following the initial catastrophic impacts on the World Trade
- 19 Center and the Pentagon, public servants unflinchingly came to the rescue of their
- 20 fellow citizens, and private citizens from near and far rushed to become "public
- 21 servants" in the name of democracy; and
- WHEREAS, Emerging from the crucible wrought by the terrorist hatred that
- 23 struck America's shores on September 11, 2001, the people of Maryland, and the
- 24 entire United States have, in fact, formed a more perfect union that stands as a
- 25 beacon for all who cherish the hopes and promises of democracy; now, therefore, be it
- 26 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the State
- 27 of Maryland reaffirms its absolute condemnation of terrorism in all its forms and
- 28 manifestations, regardless of its perpetrators or their motives; and be it further
