HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

2 **General Assembly Compensation - Rejection of Increases**

3 FOR the purpose of rejecting certain items included in the Resolution of the General  
4 Assembly Compensation Commission dated January 11, 2002 that address the  
5 levels of compensation and allowances for members of the General Assembly;  
6 providing that the levels of compensation and allowances for members of the  
7 General Assembly shall remain at the levels set by the Resolution of the General  
8 Assembly Compensation Commission dated January 7, 1998; and generally  
9 relating to the Resolution of the General Assembly Compensation Commission  
10 dated January 11, 2002.

11 **RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:**

12 (a) In accordance with the authority granted under Article III, § 15 of the  
13 Maryland Constitution, the General Assembly rejects the recommendations for  
14 changes in compensation and allowances submitted in the Resolution of the General  
15 Assembly Compensation Commission dated January 11, 2002;

16 (b) Items 1A, 1B, 2A, 2B, 2C, and 2D of the Resolution of the General Assembly  
17 Compensation Commission dated January 11, 2002, shall be void; and

18 (c) The compensation and allowances to members of the General Assembly  
19 shall be as provided in the Resolution of the General Assembly Salary Commission  
20 dated January 7, 1998.
