2 The AIDS Epidemic in Africa

- 3 FOR the purpose of urging the President and Congress of the United States of
- 4 America to advise pharmaceutical companies to take action to make available to
- 5 Africans infected with HIV and AIDS life saving drugs at low cost.
- 6 WHEREAS, Governor Glendening stated in his State of the State 2002
- 7 address "The anthrax attacks responsible for five deaths in the United States
- 8 generated a nationwide demand that pharmaceutical companies lower the cost of
- 9 antibiotics, yet there has been no global outcry or demands made on pharmaceutical
- 10 companies in response to the millions of Africans who have died as a result of AIDS";
- 11 and
- WHEREAS, Africans account for 70% of the adults and 80% of the children
- 13 living with HIV in the world, and roughly 28.1 million adults and children with
- 14 HIV/AIDS live in Africa; and
- WHEREAS, AIDS deaths in Africa totaled 2.3 million in 2001 while the global
- 16 total was 3 million, and the 21 countries with the highest rates of HIV prevalence are
- 17 located in Africa; and
- WHEREAS, African countries have to confront the obstacles of providing
- 19 health care for the growing population with HIV/AIDS, preventing uninfected
- 20 Africans from becoming infected with HIV, and coping with the effects of millions of
- 21 AIDS deaths on the economy; and
- WHEREAS, Because the African AIDS epidemic will impact the worldwide
- 23 economic, social, and political organizations, the rest of the world cannot afford to
- 24 ignore Africa's situation; now, therefore, be it
- 25 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the State
- 26 of Maryland urges the President of the United States and the Congress of the United
- 27 States of America to advise pharmaceutical companies to take every conceivable

- 1 action to make available to Africans infected with HIV and AIDS life saving drugs at
- 2 low cost to stem the tide of the AIDS epidemic; and be it further
