HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

2 HIV/AIDS in the Caribbean

- FOR the purpose of urging Congress to vote against oppose cutting certain funds
- 4 designated for HIV/AIDS prevention and education programs in the Caribbean.
- 5 WHEREAS, Before 1985, there was only one identified case of HIV/AIDS in the
- 6 Caribbean and today the Caribbean has the second highest rate of HIV/AIDS in the
- 7 world after Sub-Saharan Africa; and
- 8 WHEREAS, An organization of Caribbean-American elected and appointed
- 9 officials recently spoke at the White House about the need in the Caribbean for
- 10 funding for public awareness, diagnosis, and treatment of HIV/AIDS; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Nine out of 12 countries with the highest HIV prevalence in the
- 12 Americas are in the Caribbean basin, and the countries of Haiti, Bahamas, and the
- 13 Dominican Republic are the worst-affected; and
- WHEREAS, It is estimated that 74,000 Haitian children had lost their mothers
- 15 to AIDS by the end of 1999; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The Third Border Initiative, announced last year by the Bush
- 17 Administration, set aside \$20 million in fiscal year 2002 that is designated for
- 18 HIV/AIDS prevention and education programs in the Caribbean but it is estimated
- 19 that approximately \$260 million per year is required to combat HIV/AIDS; now,
- 20 therefore, be it
- 21 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the
- 22 General Assembly of Maryland urges Congress to vote against oppose cutting the \$20

- 1 million designated in fiscal year 2002 for HIV/AIDS prevention and education
- 2 programs in the Caribbean; and be it further
