1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

## **General Assembly - Compensation**

3 FOR the purpose of rejecting certain items included in the Resolution of the General

4 Assembly Compensation Commission dated January 11, 2002 that address the

5 levels of compensation for members of the General Assembly and the levels of

6 compensation for the Speaker of the House and the President of the Senate;

7 setting the levels of compensation for members of the General Assembly and the

8 Speaker of the House and the President of the Senate; and generally relating to

9 the Resolution of the General Assembly Compensation Commission dated

10 January 11, 2002.

11 WHEREAS, Salaries for members of the General Assembly for the term

12 commencing January 8, 2003 must be determined at the 2002 legislative session; and

WHEREAS, Salaries of members of the General Assembly increased by 3% inthe first and third years of the current term; and

WHEREAS, The Consumer Price Index has increased by 37.8% since 1990 and salaries of members of the General Assembly have increased by only 26.0% for the range period; and

18 WHEREAS, This represents legislative salaries lagging inflation by 11.7%; and

WHEREAS, Inflation is estimated to increase by 9.8% over the next term ofoffice; and

21 WHEREAS, The General Assembly Compensation Commission has

22 recommended increases in legislative salaries over the next term that increase faster23 than the estimated rate of inflation; and

WHEREAS, The General Assembly Compensation Commission has
recommended a \$13,000 salary differential between a member's salary and each
presiding officer's salary; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That in
 accordance with the authority granted under Article III, § 15 of the Maryland
 Constitution, the General Assembly rejects the recommendations for changes in
