3 FOR the purpose of repealing the requirement that the State Superintendent of

- 4 Schools grant approval for an extension to operate a school bus for more than a

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 Article - Education

14 7-804.

15 (a) Unless it fails to meet the applicable school bus and motor vehicle safety 16 standards, a conventional school bus may be operated for 12 years.

17 (b) Notwithstanding the 12-year limitation in subsection (a) of this section, a 18 conventional school bus may be operated for additional years if:

19(1)The bus is maintained under a preventive maintenance plan20 approved by the Motor Vehicle Administration and the Automotive Safety

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1 Enforcement Division of the Department of State Police that includes an inspection at

2 the end of the 12th year and a minimum of 2 inspections by the Motor Vehicle

3 Administration each year thereafter;

4 (2) Any structural repairs to the bus necessitated by accident, metal

5 fatigue, or any other cause are certified by an independent expert approved by the

6 Motor Vehicle Administration to meet or exceed the manufacturer's original
