- 17 (a) [(1) Within 180 days from the filing of the report required by § 17-310 of
- 18 this subtitle, the administrator shall cause notice to be published in a newspaper of
- 19 general circulation in the county in the State within which is located the last known
- 20 address of any person to be named in the notice.
- 21 (2) If an address is not listed or if the address is outside the State, the
- 22 notice shall be published in the county within which the holder of the abandoned
- 23 property has the principal place of business in this State.
