CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Vehicle Laws - Commercial Drivers' Licenses - Special School Bus**
3 **Endorsement**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring an operator of a school bus to obtain a special
5 commercial driver's license endorsement from the Motor Vehicle Administration
6 under certain circumstances; clarifying a certain requirement for driving a
7 school bus; providing for the application of a special school bus endorsement as
8 an endorsement for operating certain other vehicles; providing for the
9 application of this Act; and generally relating to driver's license requirements
10 for school bus drivers.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article - Transportation**

19 16-815.

20 (a) (1) A Class A commercial driver's license authorizes the licensee to drive
21 the following motor vehicles and combinations of motor vehicles:

1 (i) Any combinations of vehicles with a gross combination weight of
2 26,001 or more pounds if the GVW of the vehicles being towed is in excess of 10,000
3 pounds; and

4 (ii) Any vehicle or combination of vehicles that a Class B
5 commercial driver's license authorizes its holder to drive.

6 (2) An individual who is issued a Class A commercial driver's license
7 under this subsection may not drive or attempt to drive a motor vehicle on any
8 highway in this State unless a Class A commercial driver's license or an appropriately
9 endorsed Class A commercial driver's license authorizes the individual to drive a
10 vehicle of the class that the individual is driving or attempting to drive.

11 (b) (1) A Class B commercial driver's license authorizes the licensee to drive
12 the following motor vehicles and combinations of motor vehicles:

13 (i) Any single vehicle with a gross vehicle weight (GVW) of 26,001
14 or more pounds;

15 (ii) Any such vehicle towing a vehicle not in excess of 10,000 pounds
16 GVW; and

17 (iii) Any vehicle that a Class C commercial driver's license
18 authorizes its holder to drive.

19 (2) An individual who is issued a Class B commercial driver's license
20 under this subsection may not drive or attempt to drive a motor vehicle on any
21 highway in this State unless a Class B commercial driver's license or an appropriately
22 endorsed Class B commercial driver's license authorizes the individual to drive a
23 vehicle of the class that the individual is driving or attempting to drive.

24 (c) (1) A Class C commercial driver's license authorizes the licensee to drive
25 the following motor vehicles and combinations of motor vehicles:

26 (i) Any single vehicle less than 26,001 pounds gross vehicle weight
27 (GVW);

28 (ii) Any such vehicle towing a vehicle not in excess of 10,000 pounds
29 GVW; and

30 (iii) Any vehicle which a noncommercial Class C driver's license
31 authorizes its holder to drive, except for motorcycles.

32 (2) An individual who is issued a Class C commercial driver's license
33 under this subsection may not drive or attempt to drive a motor vehicle on any
34 highway in this State unless a Class C commercial driver's license or an appropriately
35 endorsed Class C commercial driver's license authorizes the individual to drive a
36 vehicle of the class that the individual is driving or attempting to drive.

1 (d) (1) A commercial driver's instructional permit authorizes the holder to
2 operate commercial motor vehicles of Class A, B, and C subject to the conditions of
3 Subtitle 1 of this title.

4 (2) An instructional permit is not a license within the meaning of the
5 single license restriction placed upon drivers of commercial motor vehicles.

6 (e) (1) In addition to the requirements contained in subsections (a), (b), and
7 (c) of this section, an operator must obtain State-issued endorsements of an
8 operator's commercial driver's license to operate commercial motor vehicles which
9 are:

10 [(1)] (I) Double/triple trailers;

11 [(2)] (II) Vehicles designed to transport 16 or more passengers including
12 the driver (passenger vehicles);

13 (III) SCHOOL BUSES;

14 [(3)] (IV) Tank vehicles; or

15 [(4)] (V) Required to be placarded for hazardous materials.

16 (2) A SCHOOL BUS ENDORSEMENT AUTHORIZED UNDER THIS
17 SUBSECTION IS ALSO AN ENDORSEMENT FOR VEHICLES DESIGNED TO TRANSPORT
18 16 OR MORE PASSENGERS INCLUDING THE DRIVER (PASSENGER VEHICLES).

19 16-816.

20 (a) An individual may not drive a school vehicle (school bus) on any highway
21 in this State unless the individual:

22 (1) Passes an appropriate medical examination; and

23 (2) Has been issued a commercial driver's license endorsed [passenger
24 vehicle] SCHOOL BUS.

25 (b) With the advice of the State Department of Education, the Administration
26 may adopt regulations concerning the qualifications of school vehicle drivers.

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be
28 construed prospectively to apply only to individuals applying for a commercial driver's
29 license to drive a school bus on or after the effective date of this Act.

30 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
31 effect October 1, 2002.
