1 (d) (1) A violation of this section is a civil offense.

2 (2) A minor who violates this section is subject to the procedures and 3 dispositions provided in Title 3, Subtitle 8A of the Courts Article.

4 (e) A law enforcement officer authorized to make arrests shall issue a citation 5 to a minor if the law enforcement officer has probable cause to believe that the minor 6 is committing or has committed a violation of this section.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect8 October 1, 2002.
